December Council meeting minutes were accepted as amended. The December treasurer's report was accepted as amended. Motion was made and accepted to round the workers' gift from \$2170.11 to \$2170.00. Each worker will be given a check for \$542.50. Motion was made to move the CD for \$5253.66 from Tuition Aid to CEF. Amended to change it to \$7000.00. Accepted.

Pastor's Report

- Christmas services went well. Christmas Eve had good comments. Turnout a little lower at around 140.
- Directory updating has been started.
- Thanks for the workers' gift. The called workers greatly appreciate the support.

Board of Elders Report

- Research showed that Elders sponsored the softball team. Will give \$250 towards the fee this year.
- Metro Outreach is looking at potential schools for services.
- Al Rosendahl is working with the U of M students for rides to/from church.
- The church handbook is being updated with many changes.
- Pastor's salary has been miscalculated and will be adjusted for 2009.
- Bibles for Bible class are being ordered.
- Member requested to have wider hymnal racks in the pews to accommodate Bibles.
- For the April Council meeting, the Bd of Elders will be looking at changes/clarifications to rules/requirements for transferring/returning members and their ability to serve on boards without having to wait 1 year.

Board of Education Report

- Thanks to all who helped with filling Christmas bags.
- Most of the computers will be replaced in the school.
- Tuition Aid will be dispersed for 2 ILC students next month.
- Ryan Libby would like help with art class. A request is being made to the congregation for any volunteers.
- The Bd of Ed will be checking on cell phone arrangements. The plan was to give a \$50/month cell phone allowance.

Board of Trustees Report

- A furnace malfunction occurred in the sanctuary. It is repaired for now, but it will
 probably need to be replaced soon. A small leak was found and fixed in the
 fellowship hall furnace. Must look at getting quotes for 3 new furnaces (sanctuary,
 fellowship hall, school rooms).
- A list of items for the workday on January 31 will be developed.
- Eli Wales noticed that the sign by the driveway into the parking lot had been shot up with paintballs. He cleaned it before church started. The Council recommends contacting the police department to make a report.

New Business

- Benno Sydow talked about the need for the Financial Secretary position. This could possibly be done by another board member now since there isn't much to the job with the new reports that are automatically being generated.
- Ole Olmanson talked about maybe having different envelopes with preprinted dates for church offerings. As Financial Secretary, he said a lot of time was spent hand writing envelope numbers on the envelopes.
- A motion was made and accepted to add \$190.65 to our CLC contribution for 2008 so the total will be \$52,000.00.
- A motion was made and accepted to set the 2009 CLC Budget contribution to \$54,000. This will be a recommendation to the voters.
