He reports on the recent outreach trip to areas of Andhra Pradesh State, with David Koenig. It's a blessing to see how God's Word is being proclaimed to so many.
- ◆ From CLC President John Schierenbeck: The Rev. George Dummann [pastor of Redeemer Lutheran, Bowdle, First Lutheran, Faulkton, and Zion Lutheran Ipswich SD] has resigned from the pastoral ministry for non-doctrinal reasons effective April 12. Please keep Pastor Dummann and the congregations in your prayers. Pastor Paul Larsen is still recovering from back surgery. He now (January) has had surgery to remove an infected bursa from his elbow. The elbow developed a stubborn infection. He has been on antibiotics for over two months. He just completed two sessions of IV antibiotics every day and now is back on oral antibiotics. Retired Prof. Mike Sydow is continuing with his chemo treatments for his cancer. Although he is covered by Medicare, he may enter the dreaded donut hole for prescription drug coverage. This is the period after you have incurred the first \$2,700 of covered prescription drug expense. During this hole, the individual is required to pay for his prescriptions. After the \$4,350 is paid out-of-pocket, the drug insurance kicks in again. Pastor Karp had some cancerous growths removed from his bladder. He is undergoing hormone treatment until the end of May. Then there will be further examinations and possibly another operation Pastor Karp is doing well and thanks you for your continued prayers. Pastor Jay Hartmann will be having surgery on Tuesday to remove kidney stones. There are so many of them the only way to get rid of them and stop the pain is to go up in both sides and take them out. It is considered a surgical procedure--same day stuff but they do have to put him to sleep and it is about a 3 to 4 hour procedure. Pray for one another.
