#### **EASTER PAST?**

Each church festival brings with it some anticipation. For 6 weeks we gathered in midweek Lenten services to consider the suffering and death of our Lord- our part in it, its necessity, its agony and sorrow, its meaning. As confessing Christians we however knew that the Lenten message was not the end- how devastating it would have been if our considerations had ended with the burial of Jesus. "If Christ is not risen, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins" (1 Corinthians 15:17). So through the Lenten season we anticipated the events of the early hours of the first day, when Jesus came forth from the grave-victorious over sin, death, and the devil. Now we bless "the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1 Peter 1: 3).

But now Easter is past, isn't it? Not true! Easter is past only for those with short memories. Worse, Easter is past for those who never understood what it was all about in the first place. Easter is past for those whose thoughts are consumed with the pursuit only of pleasure, and whose hope of the future is no deeper than what tomorrow might bring. Surely it is an empty life for those who have no hope beyond the tomorrows that end when they die. According to Proverbs they who consume their life in endless pursuits of Christ-less tomorrows, "shall eat the fruit of their own way," for the "complacency of fools will destroy them" (Proverbs 1: 31, 32).

How quickly however, even Christians return to everyday activity! How quickly life returns to the normal fears and concerns, the daily hum-drum of existing in this ever darkening world, almost as though the resurrection never happened. You who profess Christ, awake! Jesus rose from the dead in space-time history. He arose according to the Scriptures. He died and conquered death. He arose and restored life! Unless we are among those for whom Easter is past and forgotten in the pursuit of nothing, the resurrection of Jesus is always in our consciousness, for by the power of His life we live and move and have our being! As we daily recognize and confess our sins and accept the fact that without Christ we are without hope, we will rejoice in the resurrection of the Lord Jesus "Who was raised again for our justification" (Romans 4:25).

The day of celebration is past. But as surely as Jesus lives, the celebration is not past, but is manifest in the faithful Christian's worship life, personal life, and in his confidence of life hereafter. The resurrection of Christ is not a past memory. It is the living power in the life of those in whom dwells the richness of God's grace and whose hope transcends the earth, and who look for the greater and brighter day that is promised to all who in life and death are in Christ. Every day celebrate! Celebrate your life in Christ. He who rose from the dead, lives to die no more- and neither will they who are alive in Him!
