DEATH BY INDIFFERENCE AND NEGLECT (I):

Much fortune, blood and life has been spent over the history of our country. Who can watch the invasion of Normandy and not be struck by the bravery of men who knew that they may very well not live to see tomorrow. To this day that has been repeated often in our history. Today we must ask the question: "For what did they die, and for what reason are they dying?" Freedoms for which they fought and died are being sacrificed on the altar of self-serving agendas and pursuit of personal power. Freedoms we have enjoyed-albeit in an imperfect nation made up of imperfect (sinful) people- will be a thing of history to our children and grandchildren. We can lay blame on self-serving politicians, but that overlooks the fact that we as citizens have become lackadaisical, indifferent, and neglectful of our blessings, privileges, and freedoms. It is the populous of this country that sends to Washington those who are dismantling the country that we have known and for which men and women have died!

Indifference and neglect is also a death knell for the Christian church. Yes, the Holy Christian Church--the Body of Christ-- will endure. That is comfort to Christ-believers whose focus is on heaven, and whose hope lies in Christ and in His precious promises of eternal life.

Nevertheless, the church in the world has to a great extent traded its divinely appointed purpose and message for the philosophy of the world. Much of Christendom is more interested in political correctness and social acceptance than in the message that characterized the ministry of the apostles to whom Jesus Christ and the cross was the focal point and the substance of their message. Case in point: This past week the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) in convention validated homosexual and lesbian clergy relationships. That is merely an example of what happens when indifference to and neglect of Biblical doctrine overtakes the church and undermines faith. Indeed, the leaders of the church will have to answer to the Lord, but the person who sits in the pew and who was indifferent to Scripture, blindly following false shepherds, is not without blame.

Scripture tells us that in the last days false prophets and false teaching will assail the church. It tells us also that people will run to and fro looking for teachers who tell them what they want to hear rather than what the Lord teaches. The end result is that the day comes when the Lord says, "I hate, I despise your feast days, and I do not savor your sacred assemblies ... Take away form Me the noise of your songs, for I will not hear the melody of your stringed instruments" (Amos 5:21, 23). Indifference to the truth and neglect of truth ultimately results in the loss of truth. What a horrible judgment upon indifference and neglect. "They shall wander from sea to sea, and from north to east; they shall run to and fro, seeking the word of the Lord, but shall not find it" (Amos 8:12) (To be continued - Rev.
