# **UNDERSTANDING BAPTISM:**

In the commission to the Church to preach the gospel, the Lord Jesus included "baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost" (Matthew 28: 19). Baptism is therefore a divine institution to be administered by the Christian Church until the end of time.

When one is baptized in the name of the Holy Trinity, one is by this means of grace reborn, regenerated. In Titus 3 the Lord through His apostle called it "the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost." In John 3, Jesus emphasized the importance of being "born again." The power of baptism does not lie in the mere act, or in the water. The power of baptism lies in the word and promise of God. Scripture says, "*Repent and be baptized*, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ *for the remission of sins*" (Acts 2:38). Baptism is a means of grace through which the sinner, separated from God by reason of sin and unbelief, is brought into a relationship with the Father. Scripture further declares, "*Baptism does also now save us*" (1 Peter 3:20, 21). Through baptism the Spirit bestows on the baptized all the blessings which Jesus won on the cross: forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. In Mark 16 we read, "He that *believes and is baptized shall be saved.*" In the economy of God's grace, the washing of water and the Word (baptism) creates the faith essential to receive and believe the blessing which the Father has attached to it. He who looks on baptism as a custom, a superstition, something "we do," or a mere ritual, abuses the sacrament and endangers his soul.

Just as surely it is a serious sin for which parents will be held responsible if they deny to their children this means of grace. In the Old Testament circumcision was commanded by God. Rejection of circumcision bore serious consequences, Genesis 17:10-14. Since baptism is the New Testament equivalent of circumcision, baptism should not be looked upon as unimportant, or its rejection as without consequence.

Baptism is intended for all: men. women, children; infants and adults. Scripture makes one distinction between infants and adults. Infants are to be brought to Jesus that He might touch them through the Word and bless them (Mark 10:13-16, Luke 18:15-17). Baptism is a means of grace through which the Lord by His Spirit creates the new birth and grants forgiveness and life to those who are too young to comprehend the spoken word. This underscores why Christian parents should not ignore the Christian instruction of their children after baptism, but bring them faithfully and regularly to hear the word preached and taught. Parents err and harm their children when they think responsibility for the spiritual welfare of their child is complete after baptism. Likewise, they err and harm their children who think that they are fulfilling their responsibility but let the children make their own choice as to if, when, or what they are taught. Children are to be taught the Word of God. On the other hand, before baptism adults or those who are of sufficient mental comprehension are to be taught the Word and the principles of Christian doctrine - for example about Christ and the cross, about sin and grace, as well as the meaning of baptism. In the case of infants baptism is a means through which faith is created; in the latter it is a means through which faith born of the Word is confirmed.

Recently a football coach in Kentucky with or without parents' knowledge – this is unclear – took members of the team to his church to be baptized. The young men were teenagers. No one was forced to be baptized. Not all chose to be baptized. Apart from the legal questions, one young man said of the coach, "He said it would bring them (the team) together." Whether this quote is accurate or not, baptism with or without parents' permission, and without regard to understanding of sin and grace, and without understanding of the meaning and blessing of baptism cheapens the sacrament. There are other issues, but let this suffice to demonstrate what is all too obvious – many have a zeal for God and/or Christianity without knowledge. This kind of baptism experience is not what the Lord meant when He said, "baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, *teaching them to observe all things, whatsoever I have commanded you.*"
