THE PEACE OF CHRISTMAS:



Societies' lack of understanding of Christmas is overshadowed only by the shallowness of its repetition of the angelic message to the shepherds on the fields of

Bethlehem. "Peace on earth, good will toward men," is for the world a vague hope of temporal peace, even while the nations of the earth are continually on the brink of war if not engaged in active war. Within our own nation where political correctness from the highest authority to the daily newspaper implies that the word "Christmas" is offensive, there is little peace but only a semblance of civility until the "holiday" is past. The fact is that what is offensive is the abuse of the Lord Christ, Whose birth gives meaning to Christmas, and Whose return Christians await anxiously. It is frankly offensive when they who have no regard for Christ twist the sense of the angels' message to serve political and social ends.

Martin Franzmann put the Christmas message in its divine context: "Not the Romans but God, the Lord of history, dictated the place of Jesus' birth; He is fulfilling His promise of a Deliverer from little *Bethlehem*, the city of David (Micah 5:2-4; Matthew 2:1-6). God brought the Deliverer down into the depth of man's misery, that He might deliver man by taking up the burden of man's misery Himself ..." (*Concordia Bible with Notes*, p.112). It is that fact, long awaited by the faithful and watching people of God, which inspired the angels' "peace on earth."

When Jesus was born there was political corruption as well as all the other expressions of evil common to man. People were being oppressed and Christians were hated. Godless politicians and false religious leaders were rampant. But the greatest burden for the waiting people was the burden of sin that separates from God. Man has no peace within until he is at peace with God. But sin and an accusing conscience robs the sinner of peace. Some seek to allay their fear by denying the reality of God and the reality of the coming judgment. They delude themselves while they give lip service to the message from the very God whom they deny.

One of the beautiful mysteries of God's grace is that *He* made our peace with Himself. This He did by sending His Son in human

flesh to bear our sin. God in Christ reconciled the world unto Himself by laying the sins of the world upon Jesus and delivering Him up on the altar of the cross to pay our debt. Now, though your sins be as scarlet and though they be red like crimson (Isaiah 1:18), they are washed away in the sacrificial blood of the Lord Jesus. Therein is real peace!

Every person with an ounce of sense wants peace in the world, a cessation of hostility, hatred, and war. However, it is not pessimism but reality to say that though such might appear less intense at times, they will never cease. Man is too corrupt and too self serving. Consequently even God's waiting people suffer pain, heartache and anguish on this earth and in the midst of an ungodly and morally bankrupt nation. The unknowns of life on earth cause anxiety and fear also for the children of God. But through them all a peace fills the heart, a peace that the world cannot know because it rejects God, His Son, and the message of the cross.

The Psalmist spoke the confident faith of God's people who worship the Lord, and rejoice in their salvation, a salvation accomplished outside of themselves through the Christ child of whom the angels sang. We who understand the real meaning of the angelic message will say with the Psalmist, "I will both lay me down in peace and sleep: for Thou only, Lord, makest me dwell in safety" (Psalm 4:8). As your focus this season and always is Christ, may you know true peace — God's peace – now and most surely when you are called from life to see Jesus.
