- ◆ Sunday School Memory Work: #19, Third Article, Part 1

#### **JOURNEY-DESTINATION:**

Recently we saw a tee-shirt with the message: "The journey is the thing, not the destination." We do not know the context of such an expression, and can only guess at the meaning. To one who is not in tune with many of the thoughts of this generation, on first glance it could define why education in our country is in the sad state that it is. If the journey is more important than reaching the destination what is the purpose of the journey—if the educational journey is something in itself why *apply* oneself to attain a goal?

Whatever the intent and meaning of the statement, it did cause us to think in theological terms. Before sin, there was no destination. Adam and Eve were already there. When sin entered through the disobedience of our first parents, "the Lord God sent him (fallen man) out of the Garden of Eden" (Genesis 3:23). Paradise was lost! Adam and Eve and their descendents were sentenced to having to journey through the fallen and dismal world to judgment. A good description of the changed condition and hopeless journey of fallen man is given in the description of Cain's life after he murdered Abel. He was cursed from the earth. He was told, "When you till the ground, it shall no longer yield its strength to you. A fugitive and a vagabond you shall be on the earth" (Genesis 4:11-12). If the journey is the thing it was not attractive, "My punishment is greater than I can bear" (5:13). However, even it was not a journey without a destination. Unless Cain repented, he was damned.

Such is the journey and destination of all mankind. The journey of fallen mankind is a miserable journey. The good times are only temporary and a delusion, and only mask the reality of pain , anguish, ills, and misery of life—and they are not very good at that. Look about in the sinful world! And then the sinner dies!

But God merciful and gracious, out of His heart of love was determined to salvage the situation. What He had determined already in eternity came to pass in time. He promised the Savior—His own Son. The incarnate Christ bore the sins of the world and endured the punishment of hell. When in our baptism the Spirit of God gave us new life through the washing of regeneration, the loving Father set our feet upon a new journey—not an aimless, wandering, about, but a journey to a destination.

Our journey through this life is beset with many trials and afflictions common to mankind. As difficult as they may be, under the Father's gracious will they serve to focus us on the destination—the return to paradise! This He does for the sake of Jesus, our Savior, in whom we have full and free forgiveness of all sin and through Whom the gates of paradise are open to us and to all who in faith cling to Him.

We conclude that the journey through life is nothing without a destination. We further conclude that the destination is not possible without the journey, however long or short it is. Dressed in robes of Christ's righteousness, the journey over, we shall wear the crown of life. Each of God's children by virtue of God's grace and Jesus' atonement can sing with honesty and conviction: "Danger and sorrow stand round me on every hand; Heaven is my fatherland, Heaven is my home" (TLH 660). The destination is reached! Blessed peace at the end of the road!
