
Our country is going through difficult times with the economy and unemployment causing hard times also for our families. The national recession has adversely affected offerings. As a result, congregations in our CLC fellowship have needed to reduce budgets and programs. To date the work that we do together as the Church of the Lutheran Confession has gone on as planned, but offering shortfalls are making significant cuts in the CLC budget necessary as well. Thankfully, we are confident that our Lord will continue to provide for family, church and CLC, though perhaps not at the same level we had planned. He will bless the resources He gives us for His work.

We present this update to help all see where the CLC is financially. The following summary shows the budget through the first seven months of the year (July 2009 to January 2010). The offerings are less than what was budgeted, and the spending is over the budget.

The responsible boards of the CLC have been working to reduce expenses but some areas (such as the food and utilities at ILC) have experienced cost increases which are making reductions difficult. Thankfully, the CLC General Fund has a reserve which has covered this deficit to date, but at the current offering rate the reserve will be used up by the end of this fiscal year (June 30). We are prayerful & hopeful the Lord may prosper our membership resources so that we may continue His work at the level planned.

The graph shows the General Fund offerings over the past several years and the estimate for the current year. The decline in the General Fund offerings since 2007 is significant. Compared to the increases from 2002 to 2007 the effect of the decline is even more significant. The CBP budget estimate from congregations for the coming year is following the downward trend.



Looking forward to the next fiscal year (beginning in July of 2010) it now appears that significant cuts in the budget will be needed. The congregational offering (CBP) estimates for the next fiscal year show a 3.8% (\$32,000) decline in offerings from this years estimate. With normal cost increases of about 3% each year, the budget impact will require a reduction of between 5% and 8% in our current programs. A reduction of that magnitude will result in significant changes.

The purpose of this update is not to alarm or raise dire predictions of financial failure. It is simply to communicate the current situation to the membership of the CLC. Our Lord has blessed us individually and as a church body, and we will do His work as best we can with the resources that He provides through you.
