

CHANGE AND HOPE:

A certain politician ran on a platform of change and hope. We are in the process of learning what the change entails. We have not yet seen the hope realized. Of course the "change and hope" idea is very subjective. What change occurs and what hope is realized will depend on one's perspective, but we can be reasonably sure that politicians who ran on the platform will declare it realized.

We do need change in this nation. We need a return to personal responsibility, to commitment to truth and morals, to appreciation of life at the beginning as well as at the end. We need a change (turn) from the greed and selfishness as well as the lies and deceit that are so much a part of our society and political landscape. You can add your own change scenarios.

Change: In the church we need a return to more than lip service to God and to the Bible. We cannot equate our nation with Judah of old. Yet as Judah was the favored of God, we can speak within the church the words of the Lord who said, to Judah, "Backsliding Israel has shown herself more righteous than treacherous Judah" (Jeremiah 3:11). This was a heavy indictment against Judah! The Lord called for change. "Return, O backsliding children" (v.14). The Lord is calling this nation to repentance – to change of mind and heart. But it begins with repentance of individuals who constitute a nation. It begins with each believing child of God recognizing the reality of sin, and making confession unto the Lord, "I have sinned." There is no meaningful national repentance or repentance in the church that does not begin within the heart of each sinner. To that end it is essential that the church faithfully proclaim the Word of God - the law of God - as well as the gospel without which hope remains unfulfilled. "When a wicked man dies, his expectation will perish, and the hope of the unjust perishes" (Proverbs 11:7).

HOPE: But when the Christian speaks of hope and its fulfillment of what are we speaking? We surely desire that our nation prosper in its undertakings, and that we be able to live peaceably and comfortably here. Yet the reality is that in this sinful world we will never attain to the full realization of that for which we hope. The hope of the child of God is anchored in something that is beyond that for which men hope in the world. The Apostle Peter praised God the Father and our Lord Jesus Christ "Who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again unto a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1 Peter 1:3). The hope that is the breath of our life anchored in heaven, which depends not on the state of the economy, but is rooted in the faithfulness of God who does not change, and is confirmed by the meritorious atonement of our Lord Jesus Christ. Whatever the circumstance on earth, the expectation and hope of the believer will not perish!
