

#### ONLY THE WORD, PLEASE!

It was reported this week that a fun and games church in Corpus Christi enticed people to its Easter gathering with a give away of up to \$4,000,000 in gifts. They gave away everything from 16 cars to flat screen TVs to ipods to furniture. Apparently these were donated by people who attend Bay Area Fellowship (BAF), as well as by local merchants. This is the ultimate church growth exercise, albeit on a grander scale than the church growth practices we generally see. The fact is that publicity stunts are a mockery of Christ and the gospel. That this stunt is played at all is bad enough, but that it should be pulled on Easter to try to attract people manifests a deep spiritual bankruptcy.

Of course the leader of this fellowship gives it a spiritual twist. He said that the intent is to draw people in with the intent to give them a better gift, the free gift of eternal life. The context is different, but the sense is the same as when the rich man tried to talk "Father Abraham" into sending Lazarus to his brothers on earth lest they perish in hell. He was told, "If they do not hear Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded though one rose from the dead" (Luke 16:31). If the power of Christ's love manifest in the resurrection from the dead is not strong enough to draw people neither will they be drawn to Christ or saved from hell by a Lexus or a bag of groceries. Gimmicks and stunts cheapen the gospel!

Even in our own churches probably less than half of the people who have signed the membership roles after due instruction in the Word use the privilege and opportunity to hear the Word on a given Sunday, or receive the sacrament regularly. As we care for their souls we will ply them with the Word of God, not gimmicks or stunts, or even fine choirs, comfortable pews, or personality. To try to attract people into the kingdom of God, or sustain them in it through gimmicks suggests that God's Word is not enough—that the Spirit somehow needs help.

Our Lord commissioned the church to preach the Gospel to every creature, "baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost, teaching them to observe all things, whatsoever I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:20). Teaching all things includes teaching the law-- the law that exposes sin and condemns the sinner. Unless the sinner sees his need, he cannot and will not appreciate the essence of Christian teaching, which is the proclamation of eternal salvation through faith in Christ, the Son of God. Among our own, negligent worship or use of sacrament suggests that the eternal is not as important as the temporal. Such people live dangerously!

Our Lord Jesus Christ bore our sin, and suffered the punishment for our sin upon the cross. By His blood the sin of mankind is washed away. That Jesus satisfied the Father's will and has won for us eternal life—and thus removed the terrifying fear of death—was affirmed by His resurrection from the dead. Saved are all who believe it! The love of Christ is not a "feel-good" gimmick. It is substance of our hope and the assurance of life with our Lord in glory!

"Heavenly Father, preserve us in the Word, and by the Word. Grant us courage to preach the Word faithfully, and the desire to hear it often and gladly. Amen."


