BE READY TO GIVE AN ANSWER!

An editorial in praise of Charles Darwin said people often asked Darwin what he believed about God. Darwin objected to the question. He said his views were of "no consequence to anyone except himself." Why? Was he unsure that possibly the God he denied actually existed? Did he have doubts about his own unbelief? One would think that if someone was sure of what he believed or did not believe he would be happy to share it.

Like his wrong-headed thinking on the origin of things this evolutionist was wrong in his comment. By contrast, could a Christian declare that what he believed about God is inconsequential to everyone but self? Try this on for size. "I know and believe in the Triune God, but I am not going to tell you." Or, "I know what Scripture teaches, but it is of consequence only to me, so I am not going to talk about it." Or, "Don't ask me what I believe because it is not your business." Or "I am not going to tell you about the depth of God's love."

Scripture teaches us, "But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts, and always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear" (1 Peter 3:15). If our faith and our hope in Christ mean anything at all, the Christ believer will want to share that hope with those who ask. Furthermore our Savior's commission to preach the Gospel to every creature (Mark 16:15) strips us of any cloak of secrecy. Only the selfish would choose to say that one's views of God are of "no consequence to anyone else except himself." Only the cruel, if they recognize that souls are dying in sin and unbelief, would want to deny the Lord and His Word to those who ask. There are some things that we are to keep to ourselves, e.g. we are not to reveal our neighbor's confidences. But God's Word is not to be held a secret by us, and our neighbor's need of law and gospel – for the Lord desires the salvation also of our neighbor - obligates us to speak what we believe.

The apostles when told to be quiet could not. "For we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20). Of course if one has nothing to say it is best to keep one's views to self. As Christ is the hope of our life, we have something to say. Say it!
