#### PEOPLE OF FAITH ARE "CLOSED-MINDED":

It was reported recently (WND April 11, 2008) that a professor in a public college requires students to acknowledge the possibility that God does not exist in order to participate in a philosophy class. This case of discrimination has been addressed by the American Center for Law and Justice. This in an obvious "example of how some in the academic world believe it's acceptable to violate the First Amendment rights afforded to all students — especially students who hold Christian beliefs," said the Chief Counsel of the ACLJ. The student was required to take the class and received good grades in the class "until her religious beliefs became known." According to the report the professor believes that "it is his job to get students to change their own personal viewpoints or state that they are unsure of whether their own personal beliefs are correct." The particular student at risk would not compromise her "Christian faith."

There is certainly reason to address the First Amendment issue, especially since those who deny Christianity vehemently and regularly claim First Amendment rights for only themselves while denying it to others. We are not going to address the rights issue, however, since that is not our focus here, except to say that that reality betrays the weakness of their indefensible position.

We do not know what the particular "Christian faith" of the individual who was denied her rights is. Definition of what constitutes Christianity is itself a big subject today. What so often passes for Christian and Christian faith today - teaching of morals and ethical precepts- does not in itself define the Christian faith. The foundation stone, the source, and the life of the Christian faith is Jesus Christ. The substance of Christian teaching is salvation by grace through faith in Jesus Christ! Morality and ethics as part of the Christian life flow from the Gospel as expression of a living faith in Christ. The Christian faith is not a "how-to" faith-how to live, how to get rich, how to love or be loved, etc. Biblical Christianity is a religion of steadfast trust and faith in Christ- the Promised One of Father, and the Savior of the world. From such faith grows fruit that glorifies the Lord Jesus as naturally as a fruit tree bears fruit.

Such a Christian confession is not welcome in the world. Unfortunately it even creates tension among professing Christians and in Christian churches today. So far has this age departed from God's Word! It certainly creates hostility within public discourse today, and is openly vilified by a hostile academic world and the "bent-left"- media. How ridiculous and detestable it is for a professor to try to get "students to change their own personal viewpoints or state that they are unsure of whether their own personal beliefs are correct." A Christian whose faith is born of the Spirit and is established upon the certain Word of God, and whose hope for time and eternity lies in Christ will not change his conviction or confession to satisfy the whim of a professor whose idea of intellectual attainment and honesty is nothing more than satanic relativism or plain unbelief. Satan's question, "Hath God said?" (Genesis 3:1) is still a devilish mode of operation.

In many areas of life Christians will investigate other possibilities and opinions and be open to suggestions and change of mind, and even compromise. However, where and when God has spoken, there is *no condition* under which we can safely reject the Word of God, or give up our confession-most assuredly not to satisfy the whims of men who elevate themselves above God, and their wisdom above that of the eternal God. To do so would violate conscience and jeopardize faith! Therefore, unless we are shown from clear Scripture that we are wrong, as Luther said at Worms, we are bound to it and by it. As God is eternal and unchangeable, so is His Word. As we confess the unchangeable Word, so must we stand! Is that "closed-minded?" So be it!

Appreciate again Immanuel Lutheran College where students' faith is not undermined and attacked, but where it is fortified through the Word!
