Welcome to our quests and visitors. We appreciate the opportunity to share God's Word with you today. Please come again! Those interested in learning more about the Scriptures and our doctrinal position, please speak with Pastor Hein. He would be delighted to visit with you!

We do not presume to read hearts, and thus to judge whether any individual, Mormon or otherwise, is a Christian or is saved. That is God's business. However, *any religion* that denies the Trinity, as the Mormon religion does is not Christian. *Anyone* who denies the Trinity is not a Christian. No one who denies the person of Christ or the Trinity is saved!

Further, good works (heavily emphasized in recent LDS TV ads) of themselves do not define a Christian, much less earn salvation. Even the heathen can do good works in service to society (civic righteousness), but such works are not acceptable before God (Hebrews 11:6). The Christian faith teaches that good works are fruits of faith, not the cause of salvation!

As regards salvation, Scripture teaches that only those who confess their sins believe on the Lord Jesus Christ as their Savior, and trust in God's promise of salvation by grace through faith in Christ are saved.

Finally, the historic Christian Church drawing on the Holy Scriptures (only Scripture can establish doctrine!) has confessed its faith before the world in the following universal creeds of Christendom: the Apostolic (date unknown), Nicene (A.D. 325) and Athanasian (A.D. 450). Of the Trinity, the Person of Christ, the work of the Spirit and the way of salvation, the Athanasian Creed says, "This is the catholic (Christian) faith; which except a man believe faithfully and firmly, he cannot be saved."

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (Mormon) — is it a Christian religion? This question has surfaced with the presence of a Mormon running for president, as well as a result of the frequent Mormon ads that are seen on television.

To address that question appropriately and objectively it must first be clearly understood what Christianity is.

BRIEFLY THEN SOME TENETS OF THE CHRISTIAN FAITH:

- **1**. The Bible is divinely inspired and **IS** the Word of God (2 Timothy 3:16). It is eternal and unchangeable truth. The purpose of the Bible is to make ONE wise unto salvation (2 Timothy 3:15, 16).
- **2.** God is a Spirit (John 4:24). Among His attributes, He is eternal, unchangeable, omnipotent (almighty), omniscient (all-knowing) and omnipresent (present everywhere), holy, merciful.

The only true God, beside Whom there is no other (1 Corinthians 8:4) is **TRIUNE**: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The true God is **ONE GOD** (Deuteronomy 6: 4), yet three separate and distinct persons. Though Triune He remains one divine Being (*The Athanasian Creed* expresses the Christian faith as drawn from the Scriptures). All gods apart from the Triune God are figments of man's imagination and are idols (1st Commandment).

- **3.** God is the Creator of all things. He created man in His image that is sinless and holy (Genesis 1).
- **4**. Man by his own volition fell into sin, and all people born into the world since the entrance of sin are born with sin (original sin), are dead in sins, corrupt and eternally lost (Psalm 51:5; John 3:6).
- **5.** Jesus Christ, the Son of God, became man. He was conceived of the Holy Ghost (Matthew 1:21), born of the Virgin (Isaiah 7:14, Matthew 1:23) and perfectly kept the divine Law, yet died under THAT LAW to satisfy the just demands of the Law in the sinner's behalf. He restored life through His resurrection. He has prepared a place in heaven for all who believe in Him (John 14:1-3).
- **6.** There is no salvation apart from faith in Jesus Christ (John 3:36; John 3:16; Acts 4:12).
- **7**. Sinners are saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, not by works, or personal righteousness (Ephesians 2:8; Romans 3:28; Romans 11:6)
- **8.** Jesus invites us to bring children to Him (Mark 10:13-15; Luke 18:15-17). Baptism is a means of grace through which the Lord blesses little children with the gift of forgiveness and eternal life as they are reborn into His family (Titus 3:5-7).

ON THE OTHER HAND, Latter Day Saints teach:

1. "We believe the Bible to be the word of God as far as it is translated correctly. . ." (8th Article of Faith of the Mormon Church).

"The *Book of Mormon* is the word of God, like the Bible. It is Holy Scripture, with form and content similar to that of the Bible. Both books contain God's guidance as revealed to prophets as well as religious histories of different civilizations. While the Bible is written by and about the people in the land of Israel and surrounding areas, and takes place from the creation of the world until shortly after the death of Jesus Christ, the *Book of Mormon* contains the history and God's dealings with the people who lived in the Americas between approximately 600 BC and 400 AD. The prophets in the *Book of Mormon* recorded God's dealings with His people, which were compiled by a prophet named Mormon onto gold plates.

Before these faithful Christians perished, their record was safely hidden away. Joseph Smith obtained these ancient records in 1827, and with the gift and power of God Joseph was able to translate the ancient writings into what we have today. The *Book of Mormon*, along with the Bible, testifies that Jesus Christ is our divine Redeemer and that by living according to His gospel we can find peace in this life and eternal happiness in the life to come" (Latter Day Saints website).

2-3. "God himself was once as we are now, and is an exalted man, and sits enthroned in yonder heavens!!! . . . We have imagined that God was God from all eternity. I will refute that idea and take away the veil, so that you may see," (*Teachings of the Prophet Joseph Smith*, p. 345).

"The Father has a body of flesh and bones as tangible as man's," (Doctrine and Covenants 130:22; Compare with Alma 18:26-27; 22:9-10).

"Therefore we know that both the Father and the Son are in form and stature perfect men; each of them possesses a tangible body . . . of flesh and bones," (*Articles of Faith*, by James Talmage, p. 38).

The trinity is three separate Gods: The Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost. "That these three are separate individuals, physically distinct from each other, is demonstrated by the accepted records of divine dealings with man," (*Articles of Faith*, by James Talmage, p. 35).

- **5.** "Christ was begotten by an Immortal Father in the same way that mortal men are begotten by mortal fathers" (*Mormon Doctrine*, by Bruce McConkie, p. 547).
- **6,7**. In his book, The Miracle of Forgiveness, former LDS (Latter-day Saints) Apostle and Prophet Spencer W. Kimball defined the "gospel"

of Mormonism as a "code of laws and commandments" by which humans "might attain perfection and, eventually, godhood." According to Kimball, "this set of laws and ordinances...is the only plan which will exalt mankind."...Consequently, the Book of Mormon states: "...for we know that it is by grace that we are saved, after all we can do." Thus, according to the LDS Bible Dictionary, "This grace is an enabling power that allows men and women to lay hold on eternal life and exaltation after they have expended their own best efforts." Have you done All You can do (4MORMON.org)?

"Salvation is attainable only through compliance with the laws and ordinances of the Gospel" (*Articles of Faith*, by James Talmage,p. 422).

8. "Not only is infant baptism unnecessary, it is an abomination. Only children who have come to an age of being accountable need baptism. In The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints the minimum age a child can be baptized is eight.

When Mormon (who abridged *The Book of Mormon*) asked the Lord about it, this was God's reply:

Listen to the words of Christ, your Redeemer, your Lord and your God. Behold, I came into the world not to call the righteous but sinners to repentance; the whole need no physician, but they that are sick; wherefore, little children are whole, for they are not capable of committing sin; wherefore the curse of Adam is taken from them in me, that it hath no power over them...

But little children are alive in Christ, even from the foundation of the world; if not so, God is a partial God, and also a changeable God, and a respecter to persons; for how many little children have died without baptism!

All little children are automatically saved by Christ's atonement. Infants and children who die go strait to heaven to be with God in the Celestial Kingdom." (Mormon Website).

While many words and phrases in the doctrinal platform of the Latter Day Saints are similar in sound to those of Holy Scripture, their definition of God, their denial of the Trinity, and their teaching of the way to salvation is not Christian. The *Book of Mormon* is set on the level of Holy Scripture. Inasmuch as the Trinity is denied, their baptism (denied to infants) is invalid. Mormons practice a baptism for the dead.

We conclude that the (Mormon) religion is not Christian. This conclusion is based on the established facts of what is taught.
