Living Our Faith in This Present World

Recently while listening to a sport talk show, the talking heads were speaking of a pro quarterback for Denver, Tim Tebow. Through his college years Tebow had a reputation of being a confessing Christian on the field as well as off. This reputation has followed him into pro football where to the present time he has had mild success. With reference to his football, he has had his share of critics.

The radio talkers were speaking of how he handles this criticism. One who covers him for the newspaper said that he handles the criticism well. This then is what was striking—and refreshing to hear. The reporter said that to Tim Tebow there is more to life than football. He is anchored in his faith, and he has a higher goal than accomplishments in football. His goals are beyond this life. Consequently, criticism of his football ability is not a big issue with him. For that reason he simply goes about his business, using his gifts to the best of his ability and letting the chips fall where they may. This was said of Tebow without any suggestion of ridicule on the part of the reporter.

To hear such an assessment was a breath of fresh air. It was impressive that a reporter of the athletic scene would be so complimentary. It does also speak well of the young player. Tebow grew up in a pastor's home. His father is a Baptist preacher. During his college football career Tebow wore biblical verses on his eye black (blackener under the eyes deflects the sun).

In the 2009 BCS Championship Game, he wore "John 3:16" on his eye paint. 92 million people searched "John 3:16" on Google during or shortly after the game. Messages in the eye blackener have since been banned by the NCAA.

As Christians we are encouraged by Scripture to be ready to give a reason of the hope that is in us (1 Peter 3:15). Indeed we need not wait to be asked of that hope. We will pray for the courage and strength to speak of our Christian faith and hope without prompting. But the reality is that, unless it is apparent that we are Christian, it is likely that few will ever ask us of our faith and hope.

Our lives in and of themselves will not convert hearts of inquirers. Only the Word of God converts the heart. Nevertheless, our lives are always a witness—either for good or for bad. When our lives are lived to the glory of God they can become instruments which move people to ask what we believe or why we confess, live, and act as we do. These are questions people may not otherwise ask. Some will ask because they are genuinely interested. Others may ask because they think us strange and consequently will choose to ridicule us for our faith and confession.

Concerning his preaching, the apostle Paul asked the Galatians, "For do I now persuade men, or God? Or do I seek to please men? For if I still pleased men, I would not be a bondservant of Christ" (Galatians 1:10). Paul did not preach to be a pleaser of men. As one commentator said, Paul did not "dilute the Gospel to achieve a quick and cheap success" (Franzmann). We serve the Lord Christ by preaching the truth and that truth may well displease men! But we are bound to preach and speak that truth if we would be true spokesman and representatives of the Lord Jesus Christ.

The same holds true to with regard to how we live. Our lives frequently speak louder than our words—for better or for worse. If we live our faith, our life will serve to the glory of God. By living our faith we are reflecting the power of God and the power of the Gospel in our lives. Surely that will be the purpose of our life as we await the entrance into heaven which our Lord has prepared for us. If our walk is "heavenward all the way" it will be far different from the walk of those who are earthbound, whose goal is no more grand than what they can see and whose anticipation reaches no further than the dreaded grave. The Christian walk is one that desires to please the Heavenly Father, and not the world! It is a walk that invites those who watch and hear to join us in that walk. Our walk will be one that seeks the favor of God, that men may see "[y]our good works and glorify [y]our Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

A life anchored in Christ and His Word is a life that does not pick and choose when and where to live as a child of God. It is a life that flows spontaneously from faith, and at work, at play, in the market place, at home, in public and in private, glorifies the Lord God!

Children of God do not live their faith in word and deed to attract people's attention. Rather they do so because the love of Christ constrains them so to walk. That our confession in word and deed catches people's attention is a by-product of such a walk which hopefully leads others to recognize that we have been with Jesus. Furthermore, the Christian faith in action armors us against the criticism of the world. As we are secure in our faith and eternal hope, we will understand that what is important is not what critics think of us, but what our Father has given us in Christ Jesus!
