NO RELIGION or WHICH RELIGION

Karl Marx, the preeminent socialist thinker whose philosophy is the foundation and philosophy of many on the political and religious "left" said, "The first requisite for the happiness of the people is the abolition of religion" (Google search). Whether or not the left would identify with the quote, it does reveal a degree of ignorance in their hero. To even suggest it is possible to abolish religion is absurd. By definition religion is the recognition of a supreme being, or a god or gods. It is the practice of sacred rites or observances. It is the recognition of a controlling power in the lives of men which elicits from them a show of reverence or worship.

Adam and Eve were religious before the fall as well as after the fall. Sadly, Satan enticed them with his own religion when he told them that if they ate of the forbidden fruit they would become as gods, and would be as wise as God. Inexplicably they listened! Graciously the Lord reclaimed them from the consequence of their fall into sin. Nevertheless, since the fall every human conceived and born in the natural manner is born in sin.

Natural man is incurably religious but the religion of natural man is false. Paul said to the Athenians: "Men of Athens, I perceive that in all things you are very religious; for as I was passing through and considering the objects of your worship, I even found an altar with this inscription: TO THE UNKNOWN GOD ..." (Acts 17:22-23). He proceeded to tell them the truth.

There are two religions in the world. One is heathenism, the other Christianity. Both, though diametrically opposed to each other, will endure until the end of time. That which is established on Christ will prevail!

Within heathenism there are myriad manifestations of idolaters and idolatrous practices. Every heathen culture has a god and is religious. Heathen build idols, offer sacrifices, and engage in all manner of incantations and activities in order to appease their supreme being. They do so out of fear because they cannot quite rid themselves of the thought that they may have to face a judge who will determine their fate after death. Even those who deny the existence of the God of Scripture and/or reject Him are religious, including Karl Marx. Atheism claims there is no God. Atheists are liars. They have a god. It is their corrupt reason. They are gods unto themselves. Heathenism of which evolution is one tenet is the product of corrupt minds, fanciful imaginations, and subjective feelings which are in a constant state of flux. In so far as the public education system in our land promotes evolution, secularism, and humanism it supports heathen philosophy and leads away from the true God.

<u>Secularism</u>: secular spirit or tendency, especially a system of political or social philosophy that rejects all forms of religious faith and worship; The view that public education and other matters of civil policy should be conducted without the introduction of a religious element.

<u>Humanism</u>: any system or mode of thought or action in which human interests, values, and dignity predominate.

<u>Philosophy</u>: a variety of ethical theory and practice that emphasizes reason, scientific inquiry, and human fulfillment in the natural world and often rejects the importance of belief in God.

The following quote is a strong indictment of heathenism: "There is one single fact which one may oppose to all the wit and argument of infidelity, namely, that no

man ever repented of being a Christian on his death bed" (Hannah More in note on page 246 of *What Luther Says*, Volume 1).

To define <u>Christianity</u> we turn to Scripture. The very term "Christianity" defines the substance of what it is in its pure form. "No other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ (1 Corinthians 3:11). There is no *Christ*ianity without *Christ* Jesus. The Christian faith is built upon the "foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone" (Ephesians 2:20). Christianity is not a religion of works, but of faith, of trust in Christ: (*What is Christianity?* Pieper, p. 5). True Christianity has as its foundation and its power divine revelation. It rests on an objective Word, the Word of God which does not change.

Biblical Christianity proclaims God's Law which uncovers sin and condemns the sinner. Such preaching serves the Gospel. The primary emphasis of Christian teaching is the message of eternal salvation. Man's radical need was addressed only through the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus Christ. He took man's sin on Himself and by His perfect life, His shed blood, His innocent suffering and death, and triumphant resurrection from the dead has reconciled the world unto God. Salvation is by *grace through faith* in the Lord Jesus Christ as Scripture clearly teaches (Ephesians 2:8). Our Lord declared that this Gospel should be preached in all the world (Matthew 28:19-20; Mark 16:15)

However, honesty compels us to recognize that within the broad definition of religion there are many different ideas and teachings that are promoted in the name of Christianity by those who without attachment to a church claim to be Christian, as well as by churches which claiming the Christian name nevertheless promote and emphasize another gospel, social gospel.

Social gospel: the social teachings of Jesus and their applicability to public life.

Social gospel fellowships point to James: "Pure and undefiled religion before God and the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their trouble" (James 1:27). What they conveniently choose to forget is that the sanctified Christian life which exercises itself in such work of love is an exercise or fruit of faith. It is not the primary essence of Christianity but the beautiful and pure expression of faith which is rooted in Christ and draws its nourishment from Christ. Works themselves do not define Christianity. Faith and trust in Christ does!

The question is not whether religion in the broad sense or Christianity itself will be abolished. It won't! What is essential is that we who confess the Christian faith understand the difference between religion which is of man and glorifies man, and that which is of God and testifies of the true God. That which is of man is rampant heathenism and continues in our age as it has since the fall into sin. It is also our challenge in this "religious" age to distinguish the true expression of the Christian faith which is of God, and which glorifies God, and our Savior Jesus Christ from the counterfeit Christianity that proclaims another gospel.

The Church in Pergamos was told, "I know your works, and where you dwell, where Satan's throne is." In the face of that reality may it also be said of us, "And you hold fast to My name and did not deny the faith ..." (Revelation 2:13). In order that we may stand against the wiles of the devil, and hold fast the true Christian faith, "Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly" (Colossians 3:16). To that end "... give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine" (1 Timothy 4:13).

Pastor's Report:

- Pastor is working on a number of issues which he is unable to discuss presently. Pastor requested that we all keep our fellow congregation members in prayer.
- The expense for the bus to the concert at ILC has been paid (\$632.00). Pastor reported that this expense was usually more than covered by special donations, but donations for this year were low.

Elder's Report:

 2012 Calendar: There is no New Years Eve service this year because a regular Sunday worship follows the next day. Should we continue with a policy of not conducting a New Years Eve service when it falls on a Saturday? The consensus was yes.

Board of Education Report:

- Singing at Northtown by the school children is suspended for this year.
- Treat bags for the children to be passed out on Christmas Eve.
- Four school desks have been purchased to replace some of the oldest.
- Deliberations continue with regard to offering Kindergarten for the next school year. A definitive decision will be made in February or March.
- Work continues on a flyer promoting the school.
- Two new students, Abiygal and Uriah Cook, began attending Grace School. They are non-members whose father is pastor of a nondenominational church. Their mother will be a volunteer assistant for some classes. With this addition, the school now has 9 students.
- A discussion followed around the question of permitting non-members to serve as classroom assistants in a volunteer capacity.

Board of Trustees Report:

- Work continues on an Abuse & Harassment Policy.
- The cry room crib is to in compliance with current safety regulations.

New Business:

- A new usher team list has been posted.
- A new program for counting and processing the offerings has been written for Phil Radichel. Phil will give a demonstration in the future.
- Pastor reported his accountable expenses for the year: travel \$ 6,000; professional services \$1,800; health care not covered by insurance \$3,600; and, parsonage exclusion \$1,200.
