- C: "I am thirsty."
- *P:* Grant that we never try to do for ourselves what only Your Son could do for us. We acknowledge that our salvation is complete in Jesus' suffering and death, and that our own works can earn us nothing. The debt has been paid in full ...
- C: "It is finished!"
- *P:* Finally, Dear Father, take us from this day forward and make us Your own in all things. We are Your servants, with our dying breath may we pray as did Your Son ...
- C: "Father, into Your hands I commit My spirit."
