#### First Reading: Jeremiah 31:31-34

The Lord described what His new covenant would be like. It wouldn't be like the old two-way covenant of Mt. Sinai. It will be a new one-way covenant of grace because He would forgive our iniquity and remember our sin no more.

While He is yet speaking God the Father spoke from heaven. He promised that Jesus would glorify the Father's name by His upcoming death. By dying He would draw people from all nations to God.

## **ANNOUNCEMENT:**

"Effective immediately, we are closing our church at this location. Services will no longer be held on this site. The church building will be put up for sale. Instruction in the Word of God will no longer sound within these walls. There will be no more baptisms, and the Lord's Supper will no longer be distributed. Sunday School for the children will cease. There will be no marriages or funerals here. The pastor will no longer be available for hospital calls, or for personal instruction, or for comforting the troubled. Please do not call him. As the church closes many of us will no longer see one another again. So in closing, we wish you all well."

All who read this will recognize that the "announcement" is not true. While it is not true, the substance of it is not a joking matter! Whenever an individual, a couple, or a family who holds membership in a Christian congregation regularly, negligently, neglectfully, indifferently, without concern, or without pang of conscience skips worship service and does not fellowship with fellow Christians in the worship setting, that person or family is voting to close the church!

Faithfulness in worship is a public witness to the world. It says to friend and neighbor that one is serious in his claim that he is a confessor of the Lord Jesus. Neglect of and indifference toward worship is also a witness, one that makes mockery of any claim to be a faithful confessor of the Lord Jesus Christ. Such neglect and indifference toward worship tells our neighbor, as well as our children or grandchildren, that an active worship life and nourishment through Word and Sacrament is not something to be cherished, much less practiced. If that is the message we send we bear responsibility for the souls of those who may be misled by our indifference and neglect!

This writer was told by a young man, "I do not have to go to church to be a Christian." Lest he be accused of judging the heart, the pastor simply countered, "Why would one who claims to be a Christian not want to go to church?"

Scripture says, "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful. And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of our selves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching. For if we sin willfully after we have received the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins ..." (Hebrews 10:23-26).

As sinners we need the daily assurance of the forgiveness of our sins. This comfort is found the Word of God in private devotion in our home. Inasmuch as the Lord Himself instructs that we gather together in public worship, the faithful Christian also delights in the public hearing of the Word and in the public announcement of absolution through Word and Sacrament. How can anyone who understands the nature of man, and appreciates the love of God weary of hearing the Father's Word?

Luke 11 tells how a certain women admired Jesus (v. 27). She said, "Blessed is the womb that bore you ..." But Jesus said, "More than that, blessed are those who hear the Word of God and keep (treasure) it" (v. 28). Hearing the Word of God includes the reading of the Word in private. God speaks to us as we read. It includes gathering together in worship to hear the Word. And most certainly it involves loving, listening attentively, and processing the Word as it is preached and taught ... in other words, being more than a body in a pew!

Hearing the Word faithfully and attentively recognizes as one has said, "this is the critical hour (time) in which only one thing matters: to hear and keep the Word which God is in these last days speaking by His Son" (Franzmann). The Lord through the Psalmist said, "O come, let us worship and bow down; Let us kneel before the Lord our Maker, for He is our God, and we are the people of His pasture, and the sheep of His hand. ... Today, if you will hear His voice: 'Do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion ..." (Psalm 95:6-8a, Hebrews 3:7, 11, 15). You can read in the Psalm as well as in Hebrews the judgment of God that fell upon those who hardened themselves against the Word.

Neglect of hearing physically and with understanding resulted in the loss of the Word. The prophet, Amos, spoke the word of the Lord, "Behold the days are coming," says the Lord God, "that I will send a famine on the land, not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the Lord. They shall wander from sea to sea and from north to east; they shall run to and fro, seeking the Word of the Lord, but shall not find it" (Amos 8:11-12).

Our blessed Lord and Savior who earnestly desires our salvation encourages us: "To this man will I look, even to him that is poor and of a contrite spirit and trembles (stands in awe of) at My Word" (Isaiah 66:2). Today (tomorrow is guaranteed to no one) is the day of salvation!

For the sake of your own soul, for the sake of your eternal future, for the sake of your neighbor, and for the enduring witness of your church, to the glory of God, resolve now by the power of the Spirit of God that you will not vote to close your church. Gladly hear and learn the Word of God. Do not be responsible for making the "announcement" a reality!

## **CLC E-Devotion:**

Friday, February 24, 2012

Hebrews 5:7 During the days of Jesus' life on earth, he offered up prayers and petitions with loud cries and tears to the one who could save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission.

#### LEARN FROM JESUS' OBEDIENCE AND SUFFERING

We also learn from Jesus' obedience and suffering. First of all we learn to submit to the will of God. When Jesus prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane, it was a more intense prayer than any one of us has uttered -- and everything was at stake in that prayer. Yet Jesus concluded by saying, "Not My will, but Thine be done." It is also part of the Lord's Prayer, which Jesus taught us. We often say, "Thy will be done," but how often do you think about that? We're saying, "Not what I want to happen, Lord, but what you want." God does want what is best for you. He has shown this in the fact that He sent you His very best, His only-begotten Son. This is proof of His dedication for your spiritual well-being.

God has that long-term vision that you and I do not possess. Sure, we like to speculate on what we will think will happen, but seldom are we right. It is a matter of trust to rely on God for the future. It is also a matter of trust to submit yourself to His will. Here learn of Jesus and His obedience in carrying the cross. God may say for reasons that you cannot understand I want you to go through a financial crisis, or grief as He takes your mom or your husband away before you think you're ready. God may also allow trials to afflict your own body. In His will there may be tough times for us, but it is for a greater goal. In Acts 14:22 we read, "We must through many tribulations enter the kingdom of God." Learn of Christ to bear the cross, willingly submitting yourself to the will of your Heavenly Father.

We also learn patience from our Savior. For thirty-three years He hid His glory as the Son of God. This was especially true when it came to His death. It was not until after His resurrection that He was glorified. That rightful glory will be evident to all when He returns on the Last Day as Judge of all. The glory that you have coming will also have to wait. God has promised you a perfect body, freedom from sin, and complete happiness, but none of that will be complete here on earth. Searching for that here on earth will leave you empty and frustrated.

Learn patience and contentment will follow.
