(13) "And I have also given you what you have not asked: both riches and honor, so that there shall not be anyone like you among the kings all your days. GIVE US WISDOM TO VALUE THE RIGHT THINGS, O GOD

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION Part 10

FORMAL EDUCATION:

PUBLIC EDUCATION VERSUS

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION —

SECULAR VERSUS CHRISTIAN

POINT OF VIEW: Two teachers, one with a secular philosophy of life

and the other with a Christian view of life, can be teaching the same set of facts, but the impression that each will leave with the student can be the direct opposite. What makes the difference? It is the point of view of the teacher. Here is the big difference in every educational imprint upon the character of the child — in the home, school, or church.

DISCIPLINE: Every child needs discipline. Is the child going to be corrected according to the standards set by his peers and society — which may well mean letting the child do his own thing — or will he be corrected according to the standards of behavior set by the Lord God in the Ten Commandments? Will guilt be treated as a psychological problem that can be reasoned or talked away or [will guilt be treated] as a moral problem that can be cured alone by the blood of Christ? Is motivation for good behavior to be based on an appeal to the natural good that allegedly resides in every child or is the motivating force to be moment by moment gratitude for the priceless gift of divine forgiveness and righteousness? Is the aim of discipline to be the approval of society or the approval of God? In every case of discipline are you dealing with a person equipped with native goodness that needs only to be brought out or are you dealing with a person conceived and born in sin that needs to be born again and kept on the straight and narrow by the continuous application of Law and the Gospel in his life? It all depends upon the view of life of the one who disciplines. But the result will be either the development of a self-righteous "Pharisee" or the training of a child of God living in the fear of the Lord.

Success: Every parent and every school wants to help a child become a success in life. But how is success to be measured? The common secular standard is the earning power

that the child can achieve when he or she becomes an adult. A higher standard is serving society in some way or manner. But such success, measured in earning power, career achievement, social or political advancement, even serving mankind, can be a complete failure in the sight of God. Hell will be filled with people who were very successful in the eyes of their contemporaries. Success from the Christian point of view is not achieving great earning power, but knowing how to use that gift, as well as all other gifts, to the glory of God and the welfare of one's neighbor. Success in the sight of God is learning to live humbly before one's God, boldly before men in the fear of the Lord with a moment by moment resting of one's faith upon the Lord at all times and in all places and under all circumstances.

VALUE: All education develops consciously or subconsciously within the person a set of values, for life is but an unending succession of decisions as to what comes first. Are athletics and social advantages more important than hearing and learning the Word of the Lord? Is being popular with the guys and girls a greater value than remaining faithful to the Lord? Is satisfying one's own ego more thrilling than submitting to the lordship of Christ in one's life? Is getting and possessing, owning and using the endless things of this life more important than growing in grace, deepening one's understanding, and abounding ever more and more in the fruits of faith?

SUBJECT MATTER: The same facts can be taught differently, depending upon the point of view of the teacher. Are the facts of science to be used to discredit the revealed Word of the Lord? Are the scientific theories as to the origin of life to challenge God's revelation? Are man's achievements in all fields to glorify man or is the sober biblical standard of the ultimate failure of all human endeavor to be applied? No matter what subject is touched or taught there will be a basic difference between the way it is taught — depending upon the view of life that the teacher has. A good Christian teacher can have a blessed influence upon a child for time and eternity. A good secular teacher can also influence a child — irreparably in this life and in the hereafter.
