- Christian liberty in all that is neither forbidden nor commanded by our Lord; bondage to no word of man.
- All the Bible teaches nothing more, nothing less.

END OF THE CHURCH YEAR:

Today is the last Sunday of the church year. Next Sunday will be the first Sunday in Advent. The transition from an end to a beginning inspires the thought that living our lives wisely means that we will LIVE NOW FOR ETERNITY. There can be no future without the present. There is no present (now) worth living if there is no future. People who live only for the present minding only "earthly things" will be too busy to set their eyes on "heavenly things." It is easy for Christians also to get caught up in the chase for the fleeting things of life, instead of taking time to sit at the well of salvation to drink of the water of life. Scripture establishes the proper perspective to be cultivated by the child of God when it says, "Set your mind on things above," (the future), "not on things on the earth, (the present), (Colossians 3:2). The gift of eternal life that Jesus won for us by His life and at His cross assures the blessed future of all who believe in Him, and who treasure their future. Life upon earth is itself a gift of God to be lived and appreciated. Life is a time of grace. It is fraught with trial and affliction. It is for the Christian a life lived in a foreign environment, that is, the society in which the Christian lives here is not Christian-friendly. In fact our society is anti-Christian because it is anti-Christ. It behooves us as Christ-believers to live our life then with an eye on something better than that which we now have. That "better" is in heaven. So the question is, "What is our priority? What is our treasure?" That question calls for self-examination and self-assessment of what is important to us, and what it is for which we hope. Scripture says, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Matthew 6:21). If our heart is anchored on this earth and is tethered to the things of this life, then it is even difficult to see the purpose of this life whose treasure is no more valuable than fool's gold. Our Lord who through His atonement has gained for us a better future and Who through His apostle exhorts us to set our heart on things above, Himself tells us, "Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal...(Matthew 6:19-20).

Scripture itself compares the attainment of such treasure to a race. We know that there are many influences in life that the devil, the world and our own flesh use to get us in a concerted effort to get us off the track, and to lose sight and ultimately lose hold of the "treasure house." We read in the book of Hebrews, "... let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:1-2). Christ is our Strength and Stay. He who has redeemed us will keep unto life eternal all who look unto Him. It is He who makes living now for eternity well worth the well-spent time for the joy that is set before us.
