ANOTHER MASS MURDER THIS WEEK -

Words cannot express the awful horror experienced in the Connecticut city where a young man (20-years-old and said to have a personality disorder) murdered his mother at home, then entered the kindergarten classroom where his mother had been a teacher, shooting to death 20 children and eight others on the school staff. After the rampage, the killer killed himself.

A number of Scriptures come to mind, including: "But we know that the law is good if one uses it lawfully, knowing this: that the law is not made for a righteous person, but for the lawless and insubordinate, for the ungodly and for sinners, for the unholy and profane, for murderers of fathers and murderers of mothers, for manslayers, for fornicators, for sodomites, for kidnappers, for liars, for perjurers, and if there is any other thing that is contrary to sound doctrine, according to the glorious gospel of the blessed God..." (1 Timothy 1:8-11).

The grief of the parents and others who suffered the loss of loved ones is beyond what we ourselves can conceive. Doubtless, psychoanalysts and school grief counselors will be doing what they always do, seeking to discover and explain reasons for such a barbaric act. But apart from Holy Scripture nothing the god-less, unbelieving worldly/secular/humanistic counselors come up with will get to the bottom of the problem of such violence in our culture-of-death society. Bible-believing Christians, on the other hand, know the root cause of such violence and thus can begin to understand it and, with that, prescribe the solution to such senseless slaughter.

It was and is more than just a "Bible story." Think of the grief and trauma our very first parents, Adam and Eve, experienced when their very first son Cain murdered their second son Abel (Genesis 4). Contributing to their grief and trauma had to be that the parents knew it was their own disobedience and fall into sin (Genesis 3) that had brought death into the world. What their killerson did could be and had to be traced to the sin they passed along to him! Still today, the disobedience of Adam and Eve is the root cause of all sin, including murder.

When Jesus the Savior wanted His own disciples to realize what it was that "defiled" a man, He told them: "Out of the [sinful] heart proceed evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, blasphemies...." (Matt. 15:19f). The sad and holy truth then is that it is the heart of all unregenerate people—and our own sinful nature as Christians!—which gives birth to the most vicious and heinous of crimes, including murder.

Recognition and acceptance of this ugly truth suggests the (only!) solution to sin and all its consequences and ramifications. That solution is the gospel of Jesus Christ which teaches how it is that sinners become "righteous," that is, through a new birth which creates faith in the Savior.

The law--whether of man or of God!--can only check or restrain sin to a degree. Truly, "the law [of God] is good if a one uses it lawfully," but the law cannot change or alter the sinful human heart. That is the gospel's domain, for it teaches, "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creature, old things are passed away, behold all things are become new" (2 Cor. 5:17). The new birth brought about through the regenerating work of the Holy Spirit in the sacrament of Holy Baptism (Titus 3:5-7) instills a new and clean heart. By the same Spirit God's reborn children are able to "rule" over the sin within. "The LORD said to Cain, Why are you angry? And why has your countenance fallen? If you do well, will you not be accepted? And if you do not do well, sin lies at the door. And its desire is for you, but you should rule over it" (Gen. 4:6f). Allowing his sin to rule him, Cain's angry rage snuffed out the life of his brother.

Consider also King David. Himself guilty of adultery and murder (2 Sam. 11), David was led by the Holy Spirit to record the only solution to his on-going sin problem (which remains the problem of all descendants of Adam and Eve). The king turned to God in contrition and repentance, pleading: "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me...Deliver me from the guilt of bloodshed, O God, the God of my salvation, and my tongue shall sing aloud of Your righteousness" (51:10,14).

For sure, it is not God's fault when such horrific things as mass murders happen. God has been and remains a loving and merciful God. By His grace He has also provided the solution to the "sin problem" within and across this evil, fallen world. That solution is His gospel with its teaching of a Savior from sin and of a Spirit who enables "born-again" sinners to crucify their sinful flesh (Gal. 5:14), thus by the Spirit's power "ruling" over the sin within.

As such scriptural truths help to explain the "why?" behind mass murders, the same Holy Scriptures are the place to turn for the victims—and for you and me as we all languish under the anguish of sin's ugly consequences. Jesus Christ was born to die for us. Jesus overcame sin and death by willingly enduring the horror of God-forsakenness and (innocent!) crucifixion for us. He, our Wonderful Counselor, invites the broken-hearted to come to Him for healing, saying: "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Matt. 11:28).
