#### Brief Biography: ..... With WS 785: Children of the Heavenly Father

The pilgrimage of Esther Kristina Linnea Schuetzler through this world of sin and sorrow into the victorious glory of heaven may be summed up as follows: Her earthly pilgrimage began when she was born on November 16, 1921, in Wyoming, Minnesota, the daughter of Carl and Esther (nee Swanson) Wahlgren. Shortly thereafter Esther became a child of God by the power of the Holy Spirit through Holy Baptism. She was confirmed in her baptismal grace, trusting in Psalm 18:2, "The Lord is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer; my God, my strength, in whom I will trust; my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold."

Prior to World War II, Esther met Robert Schuetzler at their church's youth group meetings. They eventually married on September 23, 1945, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Wyoming, MN. The Lord blessed their marital union with 67 years of Christian companionship and with five children: Robert, Diane, Patricia, Laurie, and Susan. Esther worked at Northern Wood as a jigsaw cutter during the war years. She loved cooking, baking, and gardening. Her family was much of her focus in life, enjoying the time she had with grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

Both Esther and Robert were steadfast in their confession of Christian faith as they remained committed to the truth of God's Word, being active members at Grace Lutheran Church in Fridley, MN. Esther glorified her Lord Jesus throughout her life, understanding the payment her Savior made for her sins: "For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's" (1 Corinthians 6:20).

SING(I): God His own doth tend and nourish; In His holy courts they flourish From all evil things He spares them In His mighty arms He bears them.




