## **OVERCOMING BOLDNESS WITH BOLDNESS:**

In a recent discussion the subject arose as to why it appears there is so much more evil in the world today.

We commented that there is no more evil in the world today than there ever has been. Since the fall from creation perfection, sin has reigned in the unregenerate human heart. At the time of Noah "the Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually" (Genesis 6:5). Suffice it to say that it boggles the mind that evil was so great that "The Lord was sorry that He had made man on the earth, and He was grieved in His heart" (6:6). The flood to eradicate the wicked from the earth followed. Only the righteous Noah and his family survived. Yet even within the righteous the root of sin dwells. It showed itself in Noah's drunkenness and in the conduct of his sons. Then came Babel (Genesis 11), followed by Sodom. The gravity of its wickedness (Genesis 18:20) incurred the wrath of God. Scripture tells us that evil is the result of rejecting the word of the Lord and going one's own way. Consequently Israel was carried away into captivity and Judah was exiled to Babylon. Only because God is gracious did Judah return to its land. Out of faithfulness to His promise God had promised the Savior from sin, and this Savior would come from Judah. The New Testament also records the sins of men, sins of which the apostles spoke and against which they warned. We will not belabor the point except to reiterate that the evil is no greater today than it ever was.

We suggest that the evil of our day seems to have increased because of the boldness with which it is practiced, promoted, and defended. To a large extent the church in the world has compromised the Word of God and become apostate. As an apostate church has lost its moral authority, society itself has fractured and lost its way. As evidence we submit the deterioration of the home and morals. Further, the government has legalized sin and hints at criminalizing any testimony against the sins it approves. Ungodliness delights in sin and practices it with an "in your face" attitude with impunity and without shame, so that people of faith and conscience are troubled and can hardly believe that there was a time worse or, at least, as bad as today.

Ought we to not be as bold and even bolder in confessing and living our faith in the world?" Such boldness will manifest itself by first of all coming before the throne of God in penitent sorrow over personal sin, and in confidence that God for Jesus' sake has forgiven us all our sins. As dear children through faith we will "come boldly before the throne of grace, that we may find grace to help in time of need" (Hebrews 4:16). The specific need in our context is strength to be honest in calling sin sin, in turn being bold in speaking truth about sin and its consequence. By the grace of God we will speak the truth in love, praying for further grace always to speak boldly as we ought to speak (Ephesians 6:20). Hardly can we love our neighbor if we are silent about sin that destroys the soul! Speaking the truth means that we cannot remain silent in the face of the promotion and defense of sin.

But lamenting the evil in the world and warning against it serves the ultimate purpose of our witness before the world only if we "outbold" the wicked by proclaiming the Gospel. To this end we will want to pray for the faith of the apostles, people of our own nature, who for the joy they knew in the Lord boldly preached all that the Lord commanded them (Matthew 28:20). Rather than hiding

the light of the divine Word under a bushel for fear of offending someone we need the boldness of Peter and John who said, "Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you more than to God, you judge. For we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:19-20). Enduring further threats they prayed, "Now, Lord, look on their threats, and grant to your servants that with all boldness they may speak Your word ..." (Acts 4:29).

"Among the gods there is none like You, O Lord ..." (Psalm 86:8). Therefore, with boldness it is our call to proclaim the nature of the Triune God: Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. He is our Creator God, our Savior God, and the God of our sanctification. There is no god like unto our God whose judgment against sin is revealed in Scripture, and whose grace, kindness and love shines upon us.

But how shall people ignorant of the true God and of the Gospel hear "without a preacher" and how shall they believe in our God of whom they have not heard (Romans 10)? In this context recognize that we are all preachers, men and women, young and old. All of us are called upon to proclaim the message of grace and forgiveness in Christ Who died in our place bearing the just punishment for our sin, and rising again to give life in heaven.

The purpose of our messaging is not to "save society" from itself. Our primary purpose is to be instruments in the Lord's hand to save souls. Therefore we should not fear the opposition or shrink from fear of failure. The Lord has promised that His Word will bear fruit (Isaiah 55:11). Our blessed Savior will garner the fruit of His travails as His atoning work is proclaimed. As souls are won for heaven, by his Spirit He will rescue some from the boldness of wickedness and make them bold confessors in word and deed. Only the Spirit of God working through the Gospel can change hearts from death to life, from wickedness to a life of sanctification! Speak it boldly!

Boldness is not defined by who can shout the loudest. Boldness is holding fast to the Word, and sharing the still small voice of the Gospel without fear. Paul said, "I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God unto salvation for everyone who believes …" (Romans 1:16). To the wicked boldness is a cover for ignorance and fear. For the Christ believer whose purpose is to glorify God before a fallen world, boldness is born of love … God's love for us, and our love for the neighbor! Boldness is the opposite of timidity. If purely out of love God the Father has redeemed us freely through the merits of the Lord Jesus Christ, hardly will love permit us to be timid in calling the sinner to repentance and proclaiming the Lord Jesus and His love to the world!

Can we who are inclined to timidity find the boldness that outmatches that of the wicked that are not shy in exercise and promotion of their wickedness? Indeed it is possible. Perhaps one of the best examples of the boldness we need is found in Joseph who "taking courage, went into Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus" (Mark 15:43). With him was Nicodemus "who first came to Jesus by night" (John 19:39). In His death Jesus emboldened these men to act. Surely by the death and resurrection unto life of our Savior, we will find the boldness to "outbold" the wicked.

We may be outshouted, but armed with Truth and in the might of the victory of our Lord over Satan we cannot be overcome. As Paul who had suffered and was spitefully treated, may we be bold to speak the Gospel of God in conflict (1 Thessalonians 2:2), not as pleasing men, but God who tests our hearts (2:4).
