### **UNLESS YOU REPENT ...**

Much of the nation has been repulsed by the news that an abortion practitioner murdered children in the womb, as well as outside the womb. Even the abortionist community was muted by the horror of what transpired in the office of this man who interestingly plea bargained for life in prison instead of the death that he visited upon born and unborn children. The one positive of the plea bargain is that time in prison will give this individual time to repent of his sin and find peace in Christ Jesus.

While this was going on, Minnesota joined an increasing number of states which have officially sanctioned what the Lord God calls sin. With the signing by the governor of homosexual and lesbian "marriage" many at the capitol clapped and danced with glee at being on what some termed "the right side of history." Of course not all in the capitol were responsible for this travesty. One person for example said that rather than being on the right side of history, he preferred to be on the right side of eternity.

Homosexuality like every other manifestation of evil is a consequence of man's rebellion against God. Even if we allow the questionable assertion that homosexuality is a genetic condition, which most homosexuals deny, the *practice* of homosexuality is a manifestation of the depth to which sin has corrupted the human heart. That it is celebrated — "marriage" being one illustration — in spite of Scriptural condemnations of such practice only magnifies the depth of corruption in which the world is spiraling to its death.

We as children of God cannot cease in our condemnation of that which is evil. As children of God we will pray for those who practice this perversion, praying that the Lord will through His Word touch their heart that they may put away the practice of sin and be saved.

At the same time we will be ready to lend counsel and aid from the Word of God to those who struggle against this sin, and who foregoing such practice earnestly desire to be "healed." We condemn the practice of it. However, it is not for us to play God and take to ourselves the right of condemnation of an individual lest in such condemnation we turn away those who earnestly plead with the gracious Lord for forgiveness as well as strength to overcome. We want those who are overtaken by this perversion or who are tempted to it to come to us so that we can speak to them from the Word of God to their strengthening against sin as well as to their assurance of God's grace in Christ Who bore every sin of mankind to the cross, and died for every sinner.

We are rightly disturbed by the approval of that which is evil, as well as by the gloating over the practice of evil. But right here is a warning to us. What makes homosexuality or abortion more evil in the sight of God than the adulterous life, or the life of unrestrained drunkenness, or greed, or hatred, and even the spiritual neglect of our children, or any other sin that afflicts us? In our condemnation of homosexuality or abortion there is no room for self-righteousness on our part!

Scripture makes no distinction when it says simply, "The wages of sin is death ..." (Romans 6:23). It tells us, "Take heed to yourselves, lest your hearts be weighed down with carousing, drunkenness and cares of this life, that that Day come on you unexpectedly" (Luke 23:34). "Let us walk properly, as in the day, not in revelry and drunkenness, not in lewdness and lust, not in strife and envy" (Romans 13:13). In Galatians 5 we read, "Now the works of the flesh are evident, which are: adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness, idolatry, sorcery, hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, envy, murders, drunkenness, revelries, and the like; of which I tell you beforehand, just as I also told *you* in time past, that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God" (9 -21).

Lest we become smug in our condemnation of sins which particularly horrify and trouble us, remember Jesus' response to the report of those who "told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices." Jesus posed to them the question, "Do you suppose that these Galileans were worse sinners than all other Galileans ...? He reminded them also of the 18 killed when the tower of Siloam fell upon them. "Do you think that they were worse sinners than all other men who dwelt in Jerusalem?" Jesus set the record straight, "I tell you, no; but unless you repent you will all likewise perish" (Luke 13:1-5).

Inasmuch as any sin is a rebellion against the holiness of God, there is no distinction. Beware lest Satan blind us to the reality that any sin, any rebellion against God, is equally as deserving of eternal death as those which are publicly repulsive. "I thank you, Lord, that I am not like other men—extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector" (Luke 18:11) will not cut it on the Day of Judgment.

The Spirit of God recorded through the pen of John, "This is the message which we have heard from Him and declare to you, that God is light and in Him is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with Him, and walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin. If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. (1 John 1:5-8).

Jesus died to take away the sins of the world. In our place He suffered the punishment of being forsaken of God. He made perfect atonement for all sin and for every sinner as He bore our sins in His body upon the cross. He rose again as confirmation that the price is paid. Sin itself no longer can condemn or destroy us eternally! Only one thing can. Impenitence and unbelief! Impenitence and unbelief is the ultimate rebellion against the Lord God for it rejects the love of God, and the very will of God that all believe and have life!

As we recognize our sin and confess it from the heart, the Lord will comfort us with the Gospel, and with the assurance that we can indeed stand confidently in the presence of God. "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9). On the great day being washed from sin we can confidently stand before our Lord adorned in the cloak of righteousness cast upon us through the grace and merit of our dear Savior.

That promise is finally our only strength against the sins that tempt us. Therefore let us be open to share it with others who are caught in the throes of unrepented sin. Let us examine ourselves daily on one hand, and on the other faithfully and without fear call to repentance those caught in the throes of sin, ready always to speak the Lord's promise to all who confess their sin.
