

Written Word Most Dependable Witness

The matter of supreme importance to us is to appreciate the value and use of Scripture, that is, to know that it is a witness to all the articles of Christ, and the highest witness besides – the witness that exceeds by far all miracles. Christ indicates this to the rich man (Luke 16:29-31). They have Moses and the prophets, He said to him; if they do not believe them, they will certainly be less likely to believe if one rose from the dead. The dead may deceive us, but Scripture cannot. This, then, is the point that forces us to hold Scripture in high esteem. And indeed Christ Himself here holds it to be the best witness. He says in effect: You read the prophets and yet do not believe? It is true: Scripture is paper and ink, yet it is the principle witness. So Christ want to emphasize it even more than His appearance. He does not say: Why do you not want to believe the women who told you that I had risen? Nor does He say: Why do you not want to believe the angels who bore witness to My resurrection? He simply directs them from Himself to the Word and Scripture. – Martin Luther

"OH?" Recently we read on line (9-19-13), "Earth could continue to host life for at least another 1.75 billion years, as long as nuclear holocaust, an errant asteroid or some other disaster doesn't intervene, a new study calculates. But even without such dramatic doomsday scenarios, astronomical forces will eventually render the planet uninhabitable ..." Among other bizarre statements, the article said, "Anatomically modern humans have only been around for the last 200,000 years — so you can see it takes a really long time for intelligent life to develop." We shall refrain commenting on the "intelligent" life reference.

Further, it has been calculated "that Earth's habitable-zone lifetime is as long as 7.79 billion years. (Earth is estimated to be about 4.5 billion years old.) Meanwhile, the other planets had habitable-zone lifetimes ranging from 1 billion years to 54.72 billion years. If we ever needed to move to another planet, Mars is probably our best bet," according to Andrew Rushby of the University of East Anglia. "It's very close and will remain in the habitable zone until the end of the sun's lifetime — 6 billion years from now."

Obviously the progenitors of such conclusions do not believe in the Creator God. As Christians bound by Scripture we stand on Genesis 1, and all the other passages of Scripture which speak to the origin of the universe, the earth, and mankind. Without apology, Bible-believers acknowledge that there are things of the creation that we cannot explain; neither do we feel the need to explain. We are satisfied that there is One who knows what we do not know. That One is the Creator Himself—the Triune God! On the other hand, who knows what the evolutionist and unbeliever cannot explain? It takes more "faith" to believe evolutionary *philosophy*, the particulars upon which even the evolutionists don't agree, than to take on faith what the living God declares in His Word. To put it another way, we know Him who knows what we cannot explain. The evolutionists have no one to whom they can point as an authority on that upon which they speculate!

We found another interesting tidbit in the local paper (9-29-13). The article spoke of "gravitational friction." Gravitational friction "slows down the earth's rotation." It is alleged that 200 million years ago a day consisted of 23 hours and a year had 385 days. In "Two hundred million years" we are told, we will be looking at "25 hour days and 335-day years." As the days get longer the number of days in a year decreases. Hardly anything to worry about! But we do wonder when someone with a political agenda will suggest that we have to do something to fix the slowing rotation problem. Then we will have another "religion" ala the global warming craze which has become a quasi environmentalist religion.

Looking at the two things on which we have commented it seems that the 1.75 billion (give or take a few billion, no doubt) life span of earth that remains will have to be adjusted. Evolutionists and time speculators prove the point. Even the *foolishness of God*, as they describe what we believe, *is wiser* than the wisdom of man!

"NO" to the evolutionary drivel! We believe the Bible and confess, "By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the Word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible" (Hebrews 11:3). We stand firmly on the witness of Scripture in Colossians 1:16, 17—by Him all things in heaven and on earth were created. We reject evolution and the empty speculations of those whose god is no bigger than self. We believe and confess that God defined the length of days, as well as of years, as recorded in Genesis 1. We reject the excessive thousands of years, or the reference to millions and billions of years as descriptive of the world's age. Further, we believe that the Creator God in His wisdom and providential care directs the laws of nature by which the world exists, continues, and will continue until God himself determines it's end as well as the time of the end.

We stand on Scripture because God is Truth. Furthermore, unless we accept without qualification the divine Word with respect to the origin of the world and man, we cannot be sure of our salvation! How so?

What is the source of our confidence of salvation? Our hope of heaven is established upon the sure and certain word of God—the divinely inspired Scriptures! So then, one who doubts or rejects Genesis 1, cannot be sure of his salvation through Christ, because the same Scripture is the source of both the teaching of origins, as well as of salvation. If one even pretends to believe Scripture, he cannot confess part of it as true, and reject another part without losing confidence concerning eternal salvation. Why would anyone believe in a God who tells the truth only part of the time?

Since evolutionary philosophy strikes at the very foundation of our faith, the Word of God, and therefore our confidence in Christ for salvation, it is therefore not insignificant when our children are taught in government schools that creation is a lie and God a liar!

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" (Genesis 1:1). "God said" and it was so! We stand on the Word of the only One who was there, and reject the feigned intelligence of those who think they know better than God. As we stand on Genesis 1, we are confident of what God promises in John 3:16 and every other passage that informs us and assures us of our salvation through the merits of the Lord Jesus Christ.

"Beware lest anyone cheat you through philosophy and empty deceit, according to the tradition of men, according to the basic principles of the world, and not according to Christ" (Colossians 2:8)!
