#### HE WITH US--WE WITH HIM:

"That which is born of flesh is flesh ..." (John 3:6a) As Adam introduced sin into the world, all children of Adam in as much as they are of his flesh are born in sin and under the wrath of God, subject to death. That is the word from God in the garden, and the witness of Holy Scripture (Romans 5:12). Consequently all flesh is under the judgment of eternal condemnation (Romans 5:16).

<u>Nothing</u> alleviates the indictment of God's judgment against sin and the sinner ... <u>except</u> the Lord God Who in the greatest expression of love determined to save the sinner. He did this, not by overlooking sin, but through promising and sending the Savior, His own Son, to bear the sins of the world in His own body upon the cross.

As He desires to save all, and that all might come to the confidence and knowledge of His saving love in Christ, the Heavenly Father instituted the means of grace though which He calls the lost to faith, sanctifies them, and daily comforts those who through the Gospel in Word and Sacrament believe in Jesus. Being born again of water and the Spirit [Baptism] (John 3:3), the same Spirit strengthens us in faith in Christ Jesus Who in our baptism received us into himself. Baptized into Christ we have died with Him, and have participated in His resurrection as well. "Through the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Spirit whom He poured out on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Savior" (Titus 3:5-6), we have been saved and justified by grace. O, how we should treasure our baptism! Treasure it! For as we were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ we have received the remission of our sins (Acts 2:38). Further, Scripture assures us, deniers not withstanding: "Baptism does also now save us" (1 Peter 3:21). Baptism is a means of grace through which the Spirit of God applies to the baptized—infant or adult—the blessings which Jesus won for us on the cross. Scripture also tells us for our comfort. "He that believes and is baptized shall be saved" (Mark 16:16). Through the Word these promises and assurances of our baptism are renewed to us every day of our life! What a treasure is our baptism, and the Word through which the Father promised and preserves each believer unto eternal life.

But there is more, we dare say. While traversing this sinful world in which we are beset by our lingering flesh, as well as by the godless world around us we find comfort in this—and it is associated with our baptism: "For you are all the sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ" (Galatians 3:26-27). We stand in the comfort of God's promise associated with our baptism "that having been justified by His grace, we should become [are] heirs according to the hope of eternal life" (Titus 3:7). Yes, that word of the Lord is spoken in the context of our baptism! Treasure your baptism through which the Lord translated you from the kingdom of Satan into the kingdom of God, and through which He rescued you from the grasp of death and gave you life! Treasure your baptism though which He wrote your name in the Book of Life with the indelible blood of Christ so that believing in Him you are daily assured: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by your name; You are mine" (Isaiah 43:1).

What further promise do we have as we walk through this life? "Lo, <u>I am</u> <u>with you</u> always, even to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). This is a reiteration of what the Lord told Israel through Isaiah. Despite their inherent unworthiness, the Lord was merciful. Since He had laid His name upon them and called them, He did not easily let them go as they were precious in His sight. Just because they were precious in His sight, He disciplined them to be sure, but assured them that He would not forsake them. "Fear not, for <u>I am with you.</u>" (Isaiah 43:5).

As we recognize our sin, and through "daily contrition and repentance, drown the old Adam with all his sins and evil lust," (a daily return to our baptism) and believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, making no plea but the righteousness of Christ, we find comfort in our Lord's promise. Just because we also are precious in His sight, though He disciplines us with a Father's love, He does not forsake us. Because His children are precious to Him, He does not make us wend our way through the alleys, valleys, and mazes of this world by ourselves. He alerts us to the foes against whom we must fight, and gives us the shield and armor as well as weapons to overcome the enemy (Ephesians 6:10-16). Neither does He make us fend them off by ourselves. David said to Goliath, "This day the Lord will deliver you into my hand ..." (1 Samuel 17:46). "For us fights the Valiant One, whom God himself elected," Luther wrote.

Finally, when we face the last great enemy, death, the Lord will be with us to embrace us, and to lead us to the blessed land of peace and rest, the better country for which we look (Hebrews 11:16). Treasure the blessings of your baptism, and the blessed word of promise associated with it, namely, that you are His precious child, "Fear not for I am with you." That promise endures until the fulfillment of His prayer recorded in John 17.

As Jesus prayed for His disciples, He included His precious ones until the end of time when He prayed His Father, "Father, I desire that they also whom You gave Me may be with Me where I am that they may behold My glory which you have given Me ..." (John 17:24).

As we traverse this life, <u>He</u> is <u>with us</u> where we are. How blessed we are. But even greater blessing awaits, when <u>we</u> will be <u>with Him</u> where He is!

Though the time is undetermined in our consciousness, yet the Lord knows when it will be. When the Father determines, we will hear the invitation reserved for His precious ones: "Come, you blessed of My Father; inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" (Matthew 25:34). In the meantime, He encourages us to "fear not," saying "... I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself, that where I am, there you may be also" (John 14:5).

The last stanza of a hymn printed in *The Lutheran Witness* in 1896 catches the hope and expresses the confidence of the children of God:

And when my days and years are past, And all life's training ends at last. May I, accepted through His grace, Behold for evermore His face.

"And thus <u>we</u> shall always be <u>with the Lord</u>" (1 Thessalonians 4:18). Amen!
