



Contemplation, Preparation, Anticipation—NOW CELEBRATION

As the season of Advent passes, we move on to CELEBRATION. At Christmas we celebrate the most meaningful event in the history of the world. We cannot celebrate it more meaningfully than to listen to the angelic message which those blessed shepherds heard in the dark of night on the fields near Bethlehem. In the darkness of our night in this world in which confusion reigns in many hearts, and fear makes many hearts quake, the message is still loud and clear:

"Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people. For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying: "Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace, goodwill toward men" (Luke 2:10-14)!

At Christmas we celebrate the faithfulness of God Who promised the Savior, and in the fullness of time sent Him. We celebrate the birth of God's incarnate Son by whose faithfulness to His task—suffering and dying in our place—has washed us of our sin, and reconciled us unto God, so that we can confidently call the God of heaven our Father. We celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ whose resurrection from the dead has extended life beyond the days of our years in this world of sin and grief to eternity free from all sin and grief. All that the gracious God did and all that Jesus accomplished is God's gift to the world—the Gift of gifts *enjoyed by all who believe* in the Child of Bethlehem!

To all who believe in Jesus Christ, Christmas time is the time of celebration of the Gift that keeps on giving—from time to eternity—for none who believe in Him shall perish but have everlasting life (John 3:16)!

In time and history, each believer personally waits for his (her) translation into eternity, the final deliverance of soul and body to the heavenly home. While waiting, we are beset with trial and affliction, sorrow and woe. But in Christ we know that such difficulties are not punishment, for the punishment for our sin has been laid on Jesus. There is no double jeopardy for God's people. We need not bear what Christ has already borne and paid for. How then shall we look on our present difficulties? Scripture tells us that whom the Lord loves He chastens (Hebrews 12:5-6). Chastening serves to our benefit (1 Peter 1:6-7). It directs us back to the manger and the cross.

King Hezekiah was sick and near death (Isaiah 38:1). With bitter tears he prayed to the Lord. The Lord heard his prayer and added years to the king's life. When he recovered from his sickness, he gave thanks. Part of that word of thanksgiving was, "Indeed it was for my own peace That I had great

bitterness; But You have lovingly *delivered* my soul from the pit of corruption, For You have cast all my sins behind Your back" (Isaiah 38:17). Is that not a reason for celebration and thanksgiving?! As with every other word of Scripture it is true, "Now no chastening seems to be joyful for the present, but painful; nevertheless, afterward it yields the peaceable fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it" (Hebrews 12:11). Is that not also a reason for celebration and thanksgiving?

Hezekiah's experience demonstrates that we need not wait for eternity to know Christmas joy. Indeed, the joy of Christmas now finds substance in the abiding presence of the Lord Jesus whose birth brought immediate joy to the shepherds. They celebrated it. First of all, they made widely known what they had heard concerning the Savior (Luke 2:17), and they returned to their menial task "glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it was told unto them." (Luke 2:20). Do not overlook the last words of that passage. "As it was told unto them" celebrates the faithfulness of the Father, as well as the reliability of His Word!

As we recognize that another advent is past—we might better say advent season—we are still in the time of contemplation, preparation, and anticipation. Throughout the year coming there is reason to contemplate daily the abounding love of God shown to the benefit of our body and soul. Daily we will go to the Lord in sorrow and repentance for the many sins by which we have offended His majesty, and most surely as we believe the Word we will anticipate the glorious return of the Lord Jesus Who at that moment will translate our waiting into fulfilled reality.

What our Heavenly Father planned in eternity—all that pertains to our salvation—and what He accomplished in time through His Son, our Savior, is the foundation of our Christmas celebration. To the extent that our feeble hearts and stammering tongues can do so, let such celebration be known through joining the shepherds in openly, boldly, and unashamedly glorifying and praising the Lord before the world. Let such celebration be heard, but also let it be witnessed through living unto Him from whom we have life, and in whom we live in hope and confidence as we await His triumphant advent to take us home!

Christmas worshipers, rejoice! "For He is coming to judge the earth, with righteousness He shall judge the world, and the peoples with equity" (Psalm 98:9). Celebrate at the manger side as you wait for Jesus' return in glory. Say with the Psalmist "He only is my rock and salvation, He is my defense; I shall not be moved. In God is my salvation and my glory; the rock of my strength and my refuge, is in God" (Psalm 62:6-7).
