

Brief Biography: With TLH 648: I Am Jesus' Little Lamb

The pilgrimage of Lyle Louis LaCroix through this world of sin and sorrow into the victorious glory of heaven may be summed up as follows: His earthly pilgrimage began when he was born on May 17, 1925, in Forest Grove Township, MN, the son of Louis and Elma (nee Larson) LaCroix. Lyle became a child of God by the power of the Holy Spirit through Holy Baptism on June 21, 1925, at Bethesda Lutheran Church in Forest Grove Township. Galatians 3:26-27: "For you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ."

SING(J): I am Jesus' little lamb, Ever glad at heart I am; For my Shepherd gently guides me, Knows my need, and well provides me, Loves me every day the same, Even calls me by my name.

Lyle honorably served his country in the Pacific Theatre during World War II. He was in the 6th Infantry Division of the United States Army from August of 1943 until January of 1945. He worked in demolitions and as a cook primarily in the Philippine Islands. For his service, Lyle was honored with the Silver Star Medal.

Upon his release from the Army, Lyle married Florence Cole on February 2, 1946, at Kelliher, MN. The Lord blessed their union with one child, Linda, and with 68 years of Christian companionship. Lyle worked in multiple vocations for 65 years: as a logger, miner, rancher, carpenter, trucker, in trucking management, and as a chauffeur. Upon retiring he volunteered at a local food bank. His hobbies included fishing and hunting, and in later years he was a jigsaw puzzle enthusiast.

Lyle was a charter member at Grace Lutheran Church in Fridley, MN. He was led to believe in the payment His Savior made for his sins: "For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's" (1 Corinthians 6:20).

Lyle was summoned to be with his Savior on March 7, 2014, his time of grace here on earth being 88 years, 9 months, and 18 days. His earthly remains will be laid to rest at Fort Snelling, awaiting the resurrection on the Last Day of the world when our Lord will invite all of His believers: "Come, you blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" (Matthew 25:34).

Lyle was preceded in death by young son, Gregory Lyle; five siblings - two in infancy, Leah, Caroline and Martha; father, Louis; and mother, Elma. He is survived by his wife, Florence; daughter, Linda (Dennis) West; grandchildren, Lee (Susan) West and Nicole (Jeff) Magandy; great grandchildren, Thomas and Tyler West and Olivia and Paige Magandy; sister, Lois Myllykangas; other relatives and friends. We are thankful for the Lord blessing us with Lyle in our lives. Job 1:21: "The LORD gave, the LORD has taken away. Blessed be the name of the LORD."
