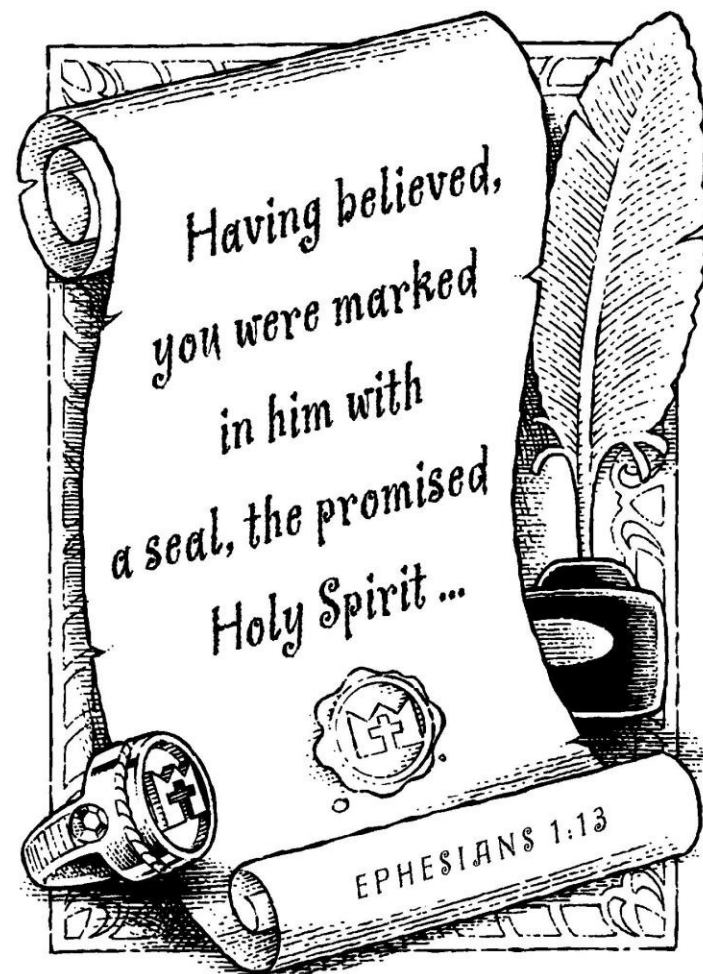

Convention Preparation —The Short Version—

June 16–19, 2014

The Prospectus for the upcoming Church of the Lutheran Confession (CLC) Convention contains a great deal of information—information that is well worth reading. The Convention floor committees will review all of this information and provide comment and counsel to the officers, committees, and boards.

The following is a “punch list” of the business items that the Convention will be considering. You may find this summary helpful for conveying your thoughts to Grace’s Convention representatives and as a prayer list.

ELECTIONS: Convention will elect officers for the CLC (President, Vice President, Moderator, Secretary). Convention will also elect laymen and called servants to each of the Boards: Education and Publications, Missions, Regents, and Trustees.

RATIFICATIONS: The Convention will be asked to ratify the declarations of fellowship with congregations in Mexico, the Conference Visitors’ elections by their respective conferences, and a variety of appointments by the president and officers of the church body (editors, committees, etc.).

The **BOARD OF EDUCATION AND PUBLICATIONS** is asking for a constitutional change which will broaden the duties of the board.

The **BOARD OF REGENTS** for Immanuel Lutheran College is requesting that the Convention lift the cap on tuition increases for the College and Seminary departments.

BUDGET: Convention will set the Fiscal Year 2015 Budget for the church body (July 1, 2014 – June 31, 2015).

The **STANDING CONSTITUTION COMMITTEE** was directed by the 2012 Convention to propose changes regarding the committee structure and reporting in the CLC. These proposals will be coming to the Convention for action.

CLC DELEGATE SURVEY: The 2012 Convention directed the CLC Statistician to conduct a survey regarding the low laymen attendance at conventions. The statistician’s report will be discussed and the Convention will have the option of directing changes in the process of future conventions.

MEMORIALS: Two memorials have been submitted to the Convention. A memorial is a vehicle by which individuals or groups of individuals can bring business to the Convention. All of the other business comes via committees, boards, officers, etc. Both memorials deal with the election process at Convention. The Convention will respond to the memorials by either adopting all or parts of what the memorials suggest, taking different action, or taking no action at all.

A **WORSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT** was not available for inclusion in the Prospectus so it is not known at this time whether there will be Convention business related to this report.

Your prayers for the work of the Gospel in our church body are important—not only at Convention time, but always.
