

EDUCATION FOR A LIFETIME—AND BEYOND:

What Solomon wrote in the book of Proverbs was written by inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Much of what he wrote could be called common sense, even by those who do not respect the Lord God or accept Scripture. Who can gainsay the truth of these proverbs: "The beginning of strife is like releasing water; therefore stop contention before a quarrel starts" (17:14). "A wicked man accepts a bribe behind the back to pervert the ways of justice" (17:23), or "A talebearer reveals secrets, but he who is of a faithful spirit conceals a matter" (11:13)

One who has never read the book of Proverbs is missing a real education. Consider these words (Chapter 1):

"The proverbs of Solomon the son of David, king of Israel: ² To know wisdom and instruction [education, discipline], To perceive the words of understanding [discernment], ³ To receive the instruction of wisdom, justice, judgment, and equity; ⁴ To give prudence to the simple, To the young man knowledge and discretion – ⁵ A wise man will hear and increase learning, And a man of understanding will attain [acquire] wise counsel... "

As an aside, Proverbs uses the word "smart" only once, and not in a positive manner, nor in the context of mental acuity. "He that is surety for a stranger shall smart..." (11:15), that is, he will suffer or pay for it.

The words, knowledge, understanding, and wisdom address the subject of mental capability. But they have different nuances. One can have knowledge without understanding, e.g. one can know of something without understanding how it functions, or what makes it tick. One can have knowledge and understanding and yet not have wisdom. Wisdom is the ability to exercise prudent behavior and to act accordingly. It manifests itself through sound judgment, discretion, and common sense. "Happy is the man who finds wisdom, and the man who gains understanding" (3:13). Concerning wisdom, the wise King wrote "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom" (9:10). As we understand that the source of all wisdom is the Lord, we will appreciate what Solomon said when he wrote," How much better to get wisdom than gold" (16:16). "For wisdom is better than rubies, and all the things one may desire cannot be compared with her" (8:11).

A person whose wisdom is of God is discreet and caring in his interaction with others. Such wisdom is described in a beautiful word picture from Scripture, "A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in settings of silver" (11:25), for "Wisdom is found on the lips of him who has understanding" (10:13). Such understanding spoken by a wise person is a consequence of knowledge of the Holy One for we read, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and the knowledge of the Holy One is understanding" (9:10). Understanding is a consequence of learning and knowledge which itself is a consequence also of the fear—respect, not fright—of the Lord. "The fear of the Lord is the beginning

of knowledge" (1:7). By contrast the same verse says, "But fools despise wisdom and instruction."

The second chapter in this beautiful book combines our thoughts when it says:

"My son, if you receive my words, And treasure my commands within you, ² So that you incline your ear to wisdom, And apply your heart to understanding; ³ Yes, if you cry out for discernment, And lift up your voice for understanding, ⁴ If you seek her as silver, And search for her as for hidden treasures; ⁵ Then you will understand the fear of the LORD, And find the knowledge of God. ⁶ For the LORD gives wisdom; From His mouth come knowledge and understanding; ⁷ He stores up sound wisdom for the upright; He is a shield to those who walk uprightly; ⁸ He guards the paths of justice, And preserves the way of His saints. ⁹ Then you will understand righteousness and justice, Equity and every good path. ¹⁰ When wisdom enters your heart, And knowledge is pleasant to your soul, ¹¹ Discretion will preserve you; Understanding will keep you, ¹² To deliver you from the way of evil, From the man who speaks perverse things, ¹³ From those who leave the paths of uprightness To walk in the ways of darkness..." (2:1-13).

"A wise man will hear and increase learning, and a man of understanding will attain wise counsel" (1:5). Where better to attain knowledge, understanding, and wisdom for a lifetime and beyond than from the Lord? In Him resides and from Him comes the wisdom unto salvation. Where better to look, then, but into the Word of God? In fact where else can it be learned than from the Word of God?

Mary is a splendid example of imbibing knowledge, understanding and wisdom as she sat at the feet of Jesus. To the fulfillment of godly pursuits and legitimate activities of life as God wills, and to the furtherance of our youth in these qualities, we will always remember Jesus' words, "One thing is needed, and Mary has chosen that good part which will not be taken away from her" (Luke 10:42).

Our young people have a wonderful opportunity in a safe educational environment to acquire what Jesus gave, Mary sought, and Solomon described. We are thankful for our Christian Day Schools, as well as our Immanuel Lutheran High School and College where knowledge, understanding, and wisdom for time and eternity is dispensed from the Word of God. As parents first and the Church secondly, we can give our children no better gift than the opportunity to sit regularly at the feet of their Savior!

"He who gets wisdom loves his own soul; he who keeps understanding will find good" (19:8). These he will find as he keeps in heart and mind: " My son, give attention to My words; incline your ear to My sayings...keep them in the midst of your heart; for they are life to those who find them, and health to all their flesh. Keep your heart with all diligence, for out of it spring the issues of life" (4:20-23).

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
