

Brief Biography: With WS 785: Children of the Heavenly Father

The pilgrimage of Maynard Kay Hammond through this world of sin and sorrow into the victorious glory of heaven may be summed up as follows: His earthly pilgrimage began when he was born on January 20, 1930, in Wakonda, SD, the son of Steve and Sylvia Hammond. Maynard became a child of God by the power of the Holy Spirit through Holy Baptism at St. John's Lutheran Church in Howard, SD. "For you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ" (Galatians 3:26-27).

Maynard graduated in 1948 from high school in Howard, SD. He served in the National Guard from 1947 to 1950 and in the United States Army from 1950 to 1953 during the Korean War. He then attended the University of Minnesota for two years on the GI bill.

Maynard married Dorothy Isaacson on July 18, 1953, at her parents' home in Cokato, MN. The Lord blessed their marital union with 61 years of Christian companionship and with four daughters and one son. For 30 years he faithfully served His Lord as a truck driver. Those who knew him realized that he thoroughly enjoyed shooting and reloading ammunition. He was a "Mr. Fix It," making whatever repairs were necessary. In later years he enjoyed doing crossword puzzles and meeting with fellow veterans. As his wife will affirm, Maynard particularly enjoyed his food.

Maynard also made his Christian confession before the world through his membership at Grace Lutheran Church, joining on May 14, 1959, and being a member for over 55 years. Maynard glorified his Lord Jesus throughout his life, understanding well the payment His Savior made for his sins: "For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's" (1 Corinthians 6:20).

Maynard's scul was summoned to be with his Lord this past Tuesday morning, December 9, 2014, his time of grace here on earth being 84 years, 10 months, and 19 days. He was surrounded by family as he peaceably fell asleep in the Lord. His earthly remains will be laid to rest at Fort Snelling awaiting the Last Day of the world when our Lord will invite all of His believers: "Come, you blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" (Matthew 25:34).

Maynard was preceded in death by his father, Steve; mother, Sylvia; and brothers, Jean and Stevie. He is survived by his loving Christian wife, Dorothy; daughter, Diane; daughter, Dawn Flesner with her husband, Todd; daughter, Tami Boatner with her husband, Brad; daughter, Heidi; son, Mark with his wife, Lynn; 12 grandchildren; and 8 great grandchildren.


P: Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me All the days of my life; **C:** And I will dwell in the house of the LORD Forever.
