

WHO IS JESUS?

In Ecclesiastes we read, "... And there is nothing new under the sun. Is there anything of which it may be said, 'See this is new?' It has already been in ancient times before us" (Ecclesiastes 1:8-9). Of all the things that the preacher had in mind, and that fit the description, we may include the expressions of unbelief that we hear today. They have all been spoken in some way before. Of all the things that men have dreamed and have set forth that are contrary to God's Word and will, "It has already been in ancient times before us."

To the Pharisees Jesus addressed the question, "What do you think about the Christ? Whose Son is He? We could say they were half right when they answered, "The Son of David." (Matthew 22:42). Half right, however, does not make it. In the familiar interaction with the disciples, Jesus asked, "Who do men say that I, the Son of Man, am? So they said, 'Some say John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets'" (Matthew 16:13-16). Jesus then asked the disciples the critical question, one that each who claims to know or follow Jesus must answer for himself. Peter answered, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." That is the whole answer and the correct one. Jesus our Immanuel—God with us—is the Son of God! The salvation of the sinner hangs on the answer for we read in 1 John 5, "He who does not have the Son of God does not have life." People who simply believe in Jesus' existence do not believe in Jesus unto salvation, unless they believe in Jesus as true God (and Man) as well as the Son of God.

The Christian faith is monotheistic, that is, we believe in and confess one God. In Deuteronomy 6:4 we read, "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one!" But who is the one God? Scripture reveals that He is Triune. There is one God, but in the mystery of the Godhead there are three separate, distinct persons. Time and again Scripture speaks of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. The Triune God was present at Jesus' baptism (Matthew 3:16-17). The disciples were commissioned to preach the Gospel in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost (Matthew 28:19). The Aaronic blessing (Numbers 6:24-26) as well as the apostolic blessing (2 Corinthians 13:14) witness to the Trinity. One can choose not to believe in the Triune God, but then one is not a Christian for according to the Athanasian Creed, "The catholic (Christian) faith is this that we worship one God in Trinity, and Trinity in unity ... But the Godhead of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost is all one; the glory equal, the majesty co-eternal ... The Father eternal, the Son eternal, and the Holy Ghost eternal. And yet they are not three Eternals, but one Eternal ..." (TLH-Page 53).

Many heathen religions also claim monotheism, but consider: While the **Jews** are monotheistic in their confession, citing Deuteronomy 6:4, they say, "The Jewish view of Jesus of Nazareth is that he was an ordinary Jewish man and preacher living during the Roman occupation of the Holy Land in the first century C.E. The Romans executed him - and also executed many other nationalistic and religious Jews--for speaking out against Roman authority and

abuses ... Jews do not believe that Jesus was divine, the Son of God, or the Messiah prophesied in Jewish scriptures. He is seen as a "false messiah ..." (about Religion—online—written by a "Jewish expert").

Islam confesses one god. Allah is his name. Of Jesus it says "The Messiah, Jesus, son of Mary, was only the Messenger of God ..." Note how they speak of the Messiah, and of Mary as Jesus' mother. Muslims claim that Jesus was a Muslim. The Quran says that Jesus Himself never claimed to be the Son of God.

Mormons speak highly of Jesus but they teach that "God created both Satan and Jesus, and in that respect, they are brothers. But in that respect, every person who ever lived is a brother or sister to every other person, because we are all children of God. If we are all God's children, then we are siblings to every child of God. It no more demeans Jesus to be Satan's spirit brother than it does for any of us to be related to evil people who have lived on the earth" (Mormon website). According to the same source they teach that "members of the Godhead are united in purpose and will but consist of three separate Beings: God, the Eternal Father; Jesus Christ, His Son, our Redeemer; and the Holy Ghost. This view of the Godhead is based on ancient and modern revelation, and Mormons' belief in the personal appearance of the Father and the Son to Joseph Smith in 1820."

Jews and Muslims, in spite of their animosity toward one another, have one thing in common. They deny that Jesus is God and that He is the Son of God. The Mormons deny the Trinity. Furthermore, God did not create Jesus, nor did God create the devil!

The Christian's confidence of the Godhead and the person of Christ as God and Man as well as the Son of God is based upon the inspired Scriptures. The inspired Scriptures, Old and New Testament, testify of the birth and life of Christ as well as does the Father's divinely recorded testimony of Jesus. "This is my beloved Son in Whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17). It is confirmed by the testimony at the cross when Jesus said "Father, into Your hands I commit My spirit" (Luke 23:45). Even one who crucified the Lord bore witness, "Truly this was the Son of God" (Matthew 27:54) God said through the apostle Paul that Jesus was "declared to be the Son of God ..." (Romans 1:4) by His resurrection from the dead. That is who Jesus is—the Son of God Who at the same time in the mystery of the Godhead is one with the Father. He said, "I and My Father are one" (John 10:30).

There is no error that has not "already been in ancient times before us." But this is our time. In our confession of Jesus it is essential that we speak clearly about Who He is and in Whom we believe. The Lord God said through His disciple John, "These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life, and *that you may continue to believe in the name of the Son of God*" (1 John 5:13).
