<u>WEKNOW WHERE LESUSIS WHEREARET HEY?</u>

Among the gods there is none like You, O Lord; nor are there any works like Your works ... For You are great and do wondrous things; You alone are God (Psalm 86: 8,10). Inasmuch as there is none like You, O Lord [You are great, and Your name is great in might], Who would not fear You, O King of the nations? For this is Your rightful due (Jeremiah 10:6-7).

So Who is the God extolled by the Psalmist and by Jeremiah? He is the eternal God -- Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. He is the God beside whom there is none other. He is God Who by the power of the Spirit breathed into the holy writers the Scriptures, His Word! He is the Creator, the Redeemer, the Sanctifier. He alone is the God of our salvation, the God Who manifested His love to fallen man in the person of Jesus Christ.

The God of Scripture is *not the founder* of the Christian religion. The God of Scripture is *the essence* of the Christian religion. The Christian religion is the absolute, that is to say, the absolutely perfect religion. It is not in need of any supplementation or improvement, and it cannot be developed to a higher degree of perfection. It is unsurpassable. (*) It is the absolute for two reasons. 1) It conveys the perfect salvation. 2) It is perfect and unsurpassable because its source and norm is not the word of man, but God s own Word, which is perfect and beyond criticism. (*)

By the Word revealed to us in the Scripture we are converted from unbelief to faith in Christ Who is the foundation of all that we believe and hope. He is the Word in Person, the Word Who by His suffering and death, and resurrection promises and gives eternal life to all who believe in Him. He is the essence and confirmation of the hope that is the message of the empty tomb celebrated with thanksgiving at Easter. *He is our hope* (1 Timothy 1:1).

The Christian religion is the *only* religion whose God lives. Heathen religions all have a god, but one of their own making. There are some heathen religions, e.g. Islam, that speak of Christ, but speak of Him only as a prophet. Islam, as well as any other religion that denies the person of Christ His humanity and divinity and teaches salvation by works is heathen.

Our Lord Jesus spoke the Word of the Father. Through His Word He called sinners to himself. Come unto Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest (Matthew 11:28). Jesus, Priest and King, indeed was the ultimate Prophet. In the temple He was handed the book of the prophet Isaiah ... (Luke 4:17) And when He had opened the book He read: The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because He has anointed Me to preach the gospel to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim

liberty to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed; to proclaim the acceptable year of the <u>Legred</u> 18-19)

Our Prophet, Priest, and King died as the Lamb of God and has cleansed us from sin and unrighteousness and given life to everyone who believes in Him. That is our Easter joy, our comfort in death, and our certainty of heaven!

How different from all other religions! Every other religion can take you to the grave of its prophet, if it claims one. Every other religion may ostensibly take you to the grave of that one whom it venerates and follows. The prophets and gods of every heathen religion are dead!

The most that Christians can do is visit what is presumed to have been the grave site the tomb of Jesus Christ. But He is not there! He who died is risen! He is alive! The angel said to the women, Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for He is risen, as He said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay (Matthew 28:5-6). The apostle Paul wrote, But now is Christ risen from the dead, and has become the first-fruits of those who have fallen asleep (1 Corinthians 15:20). In the same chapter he reports of all who saw Jesus after His resurrection. Among them were the disciples with whom the risen Lord Jesus walked on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-31).

And where is Jesus today? He ascended to heaven to the right hand of God the Father. Jesus returned to the glory that was His before He came to earth. He now is preparing the place for each believer in heaven (John 14:1-3). He is ascended but still, by His own Word, Immanuel with us even now as He said, I am with you always, even to the end of the age (Matthew 28:20). Our living, ascended Lord knows us and is present with us, as Psalm 139 says so beautifully. At His call we will be with Him for He Who said, Because I LIVE, YOU SHALL LIVE also (John 14:19) also said that where He is we shall be also (John 14:3).

In the early Church the traditional greeting was the mutual assurance of Christ's resurrection. Christ is arisen to which came the response, He is risen indeed. That is still the joyous faith and confession of the redeemed children of God.

And where again are the prophets and gods of the heathen? O yes, they are dead!
