

IT IS NOT ABOUT WINNING THE ARGUMENT

Detractors of Holy Scripture frequently get in the face of a Bible-believer and denigrate the Scriptures. Thinking they can match wits with God, they think that they have accomplished something if they can stump the Bible-believer and perhaps make him and the Bible look foolish. They do so by making comments, or asking questions that are not asked for the purpose of learning, but to ridicule.

The manner of our response is important. Jesus did not counter with a question, but he did counter with an irrefutable logic when speaking to the accusatory scribes. "If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand" (Mark 3: 23-26).

Such challenges are always a reminder to us of the importance of getting into the Scriptures, first of all for our own benefit and blessing, but also that we can stop the mouths of the gainsayers (those who speak against the Lord and His Word). Such are not new in the world. Paul wrote to Titus, concerning a bishop (a spiritual overseer) that he should "hold[ing} fast the faithful word as he has been taught, that he may be able, by sound doctrine, both to exhort and convict those who contradict. For there are many insubordinate, both idle talkers and deceivers, especially those of the circumcision, whose mouths must be stopped ..." (Titus 1:9-10). Paul was speaking to a specific situation. Nevertheless, his advice is to the point also in our day. Further, while Paul was speaking of overseers, his pastoral counsel is worthy of acceptance by Christians in general who are confronted in the world by people who demean Christ and the Word of Life. Notice that the appropriate response is by applying "sound doctrine."

Two things come to mind here. By responding with sound doctrine, we will not be drawn into the mire with the inquisitor, and we will not get lost in the haze of reason. Secondly the approach to winning souls is not by the exercise of reason. We do not come from the position of trying to win an argument. The Christian intent is to win a soul who is outside the kingdom of God, or a professing Christian who is endangering his soul. The only thing that can convert a heart and win a soul is the Word of God through which the Spirit of God works. "For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword ..." (Hebrews 4:12).

In addressing those who mock the Lord, His Word, and finally our faith, we need to use the Law of God. The Gospel seed does not bear fruit when thrown on concrete. The heart needs to be crushed. That is the function of the Law. The Law is the hammer that prepares the hard heart for the seed of the Gospel to take root. It is the Gospel that changes the heart from mocking God to love for God, from death to life. The Word, specifically the Gospel, is "the power of God to salvation for everyone that believes" (Romans 1:16).

In the context of applying the Law, we might respond to challengers by throwing back a question at them. Frequently, unfortunately, we may need to respond in like fashion to such as profess to be Christians.

To those who claim to be Christian but say, "I do not believe the whole Bible is the Word of God," one may counter with the question, "Who then decides what in the Bible is the Word of God and what is not? You say that you believe that Jesus died for you, but deny that the whole Bible is the Word of God. Since the Bible is the source of the salvation message how do you know that what you claim to believe is true? " Or "You say you believe the Bible, but you still deny the Genesis creation narrative. What makes one part of the Bible more believable for you than another?" Or, "You say you believe in God. The God in whom you claim to believe tells us that the Scriptures are His Word, for He inspired their content. If not everything in the Bible is truth, are you saying that God in whom you claim to believe is a liar? Or are you saying He was incapable of speaking clearly?"

Who gives man the authority to pick and choose what is God's Word and what is not? The irrefutable reality is that if one does not believe the whole Bible, he cannot be sure of any of it.

One, who espouses the preposterous evolutionary idea that the world and man himself are a consequence of random, chance, happenings might be asked when evolution stopped. What was the origin of the substance from which the world was allegedly made? I could suggest that the house in which I live had no planner, no designer and no constructor, but that it arose happenstance overnight out of the earth? By his response to the absurdity of my comment, the detractor of God and Scripture obliterates his own claim that the intricacies of nature and man himself just happened. Enough!

The most that such argumentation can accomplish is to show the absurdity of the accuser's argument, and perhaps at very most make him pause before he takes on a Bible-believer. If our response, however, causes one to look into Scripture, even secretly, perhaps the Spirit will work a miracle through the Word. One positive on a personal level could be that we are reminded that God's wisdom is wiser than that of men.

Of course, the bottom line is that anyone who doubts Scripture, and questions the faithfulness of the Lord God and the reliability of any part of the inspired Scriptures puts his eternal welfare into jeopardy. It behooves us to speak the truth, always in love for God and for our neighbor. That means that we speak the Law in its fullness, and proclaim the Gospel in its beauty and grace. We will add to or subtract nothing from the Word but will speak what is committed to us as faithful witnesses of our Lord. Our purpose is not to win an argument, but rather to be instruments of the Spirit of God by speaking the Word of God through which He convicts on one hand, and creates faith unto salvation, on the other. In speaking truth without wavering we reflect the heart of the Father Who desires the salvation of all.

It is a given that before we try to convince the gainsayers, we must ourselves know the Word, and trust it without reservation. We want to live in the Word ourselves. As we are convinced in our own heart that the whole Scripture is the inspired Word of God and therefore truth, and as we are convinced in our own heart of the Father's love for us in Christ, we will be prepared to give answer to those who ask or challenge. Be prepared to speak; speak when the opportunity or necessity arises. Then get out of the way, and let the Spirit work.

It is not about winning an argument. It is all about loving our neighbor so much that we share the message of the Lord Jesus, Who is "not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance" (2 Peter 3:9).
