- · General Fund offerings are \$44,570 less than budget for July and August
- · General Fund spending was \$5,556 over budget for July and August
- ILC balance is positive \$139,732 because of fall registration payments
- MDF expenditures for August were \$19,154, major items included \$3,480 for foreign visitation, and \$12,000 for disaster relief
- . IIF spent \$375 for work on one of the professorages in August
- The Student Aid balance is \$9,822 with receipts of \$14,000 in investment earnings and \$18,060 in loan payments year-to-date and \$22,531 spent in student support
- The ILC Building received \$11,473 from congregation and special offerings in August
