LOUIE THE LANCER NEEDS YOUR HELP!



The Immanuel Athletic Boosters (IAB) was formed over 10 years ago as means to engage

friends and supporters of Immanuel High School in various efforts to enhance Immanuel High School athletics. For nearly all of those years, IAB has organized a service group to work the annual Country Jam event in Eau Claire, earning on average about \$4000/year for those efforts. The results of those earning efforts have allowed IAB to provide the following items to ILHS.

→ Glass backboards for all the practice baskets in the gymnasium, new scoreboard system for the gymnasium, automated basketball shooting machine, material and labor for dugouts on the baseball field, chain link fencing for both the softball and baseball field, new electric service to the lower athletic field that will be able to power a future well pump, electricity to storage sheds, concession stand, and any other electrical demand, stage protection and wall mats in the gymnasium, IED in the gymnasium, baseball/softball field infield grooming machine, and numerous other smaller items.

Our next big project is the drilling of a well, installation of a well pump, and irrigation system for both the softball and baseball fields. As fees continue to rise to use public baseball fields in Eau Claire, the irrigation system would allow ILHS fields to be used for all home games at a considerable cost savings to ILHS.

So...what does this have to do with you?

IAB is always looking to expand its list of volunteers as opportunities are found to expand our ability to earn funds for ILHS. Last year, the owner of Country Jam started the Blue Ox Bluegrass Music Festival in Eau Claire, and engaged IAB for a number of paid services. This year the Blue Ox is again offering IAB first chance at a number of paid service positions. Our earning potential for the 2-1/2 day event would be over \$2000 ... If we can staff it.

The days and hours for the Blue Ox event are:

 Saturday, June 11
 4:30 pm - 11:30 pm

We are breaking the Friday and Saturday into a 1^{st} shift between 10:30 am and 5:30 pm, and a 2^{nd} shift from 5:30 pm to 11:30 pm. You can work one shift, both shifts, one day, or every day. Every little bit helps! The Blue Ox is a very low key event with total ticket sales estimates at 4500, compared to Country Jam which may have 25,000-30,000 per day. The service work we provide can be done by almost anyone and always with other IAB partners.

Folks who have participated in these past IAB efforts have found them to be extremely enjoyable, entertaining, and rewarding. A fun time is had by all!!!

A MOTHER'S INFLUENCE

How do you teach your children about creation? We sometimes make this challenge more difficult than it really is. You don't need a degree in science, and previous experience digging for fossils isn't a requirement. Expertise in theology, a jaw-dropping testimony, or years of church service aren't necessities. You simply *introduce your child to the Creator of the universe*.

Seek to lead your little one to the Lord at an early age. The Holy Spirit becomes their Helper, leading them to a deeper understanding in spiritual matters. He also helps you in teaching your children about their Creator.

Foster a sense of wonder. Let them experience the wonders of creation—take them to Grand Canyon, on nature walks, and to museums. Catch fireflies and stargaze. Give them relaxed environments full of unstructured time to explore and discover the majesty of God's handiwork.

Provide an environment of curiosity—welcome the "what if" and "what about" and never-ending "why" questions. Don't discourage them if you're unsure of the answers. Don't be afraid to say "I don't know, but I know where to look. Let's find out together!" Teach them where to go for answers, and establish the Bible as the ultimate authority. Don't worry about the chicken or the egg questions—you've got this!

Equip yourself and your kids with biblical and scientific knowledge. ... Learn the problems of evolution and become confident in what the Bible says about creation. As a parent, God has placed you in a strategic position in your child's life. Your relationship with your child gives you a position of influence like none other on Earth. You can diminish the impact and even silence the voices from evolutionary sources.

Be a good ambassador of Christ in your home. Be kind. It's easy to bark commands when you have limited sleep and a hectic schedule, but take the time to demonstrate respect for your children. When you are a good representative of Christ in the home—when you exhibit the love of Jesus—your children will most likely want to identify with you and the things you value. Examine how you treat your children. Do you treat them as worthy treasures, made in the image of God?

Take advantage of opportunities as they come up—the teachable moments. You have the advantage of being there for your child today. You can't count on both of you being there tomorrow. My own dear mother went to be with the Lord a few weeks after my 20th birthday. I watched her take her last breath and felt sudden, smothering panic. And the silly thing that came to my mind in that tragic instant was that I forgot to ask her how to make her banana pudding. The need to know the recipe was, obviously, insignificant—but the longing to hold on to my mother was monumental. Along with the devastation of losing my best friend, I remember feeling the loss of everything she was and her wealth of experiences and wisdom—memories, stories of our heritage, knowledge from her education and experiences, her unique perspective on life, her presence, and her love. I can assure you, your child would feel the same devastating loss if you went to be with the Lord today. You are the keeper of their childhood and everything precious to them.

This Mother's Day, embrace the privilege of being your child's mother. Share what the Lord has poured into your life. Don't miss the opportunities. Teach your child the wonders of creation and the sweetness of walking through life with their Creator.

IN HEAVEN WHERE GOD IS, THERE I WANT TO BE--FOREVER

Eternity: Infinite time without beginning or end ... The timeless state following death ... The afterlife; immortality. Speaking from the perspective of people who believe that "Jesus Christ, is true God begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true Man born of the virgin Mary is my Lord," and that "He has redeemed me a lost and condemned creature, purchased and won me from all sin, from death and from the power of the devil," we look forward to the life promised to us in eternity in heaven.

At His ascension our Savior was parted from His disciples and was "carried up into heaven" (Luke 24:51). Luke tells us in Acts that Jesus "was taken up, and a cloud received Him out of their sight" (Acts 1:9). Those words lead to all manner of speculation of where heaven is, how high it is. One Russian cosmonaut in the early years of space travel said he was in heaven and did not see God. As an aside, hell is spoken of as being down. How far? Such idle speculation is useless and wrong if for no other reason than it is applying temporal elements to the eternal. Except that God speaks to us in terms with which we can identify, we will be careful lest in our interest to know we go beyond Scripture. Therefore to the question itself we simply say, "Hell is where the devil is and God is not! Heaven is where God is! Furthermore, we do not care to find out, nor do we intend to find out by experience, where hell is.

More important than speculating about where hell is, is turning one's attention to avoiding it, and arriving in heaven. Scripture speaks clearly to that. "He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned" (Mark 16:16).

Scripture which says "Heaven and the earth will pass away" $_{(Matthew\ 24:35)}$ also speaks of a new heaven and a new earth. Peter wrote: "But the day of the Lord (Judgment Day) will come as a thief in the night, in which the heaven will pass away with a great noise, and the elements will melt with fervent heat; both the earth and the works that are in it will be burned up" $_{(2\ Peter\ 3:12)}$. "Nevertheless we, according to His promise, look for new heavens and a new earth in which righteousness dwells" $_{(3:13)}$.

What we know for sure is that the universe including the earth befouled by sin and death will cease to be as we know it now! The Lord said through the prophet, "For behold, I create new heavens and a new earth; and the former shall not remembered or come to mind" (Isaiah 65:17). In the 66th chapter the Lord speaks of the new heavens and the new earth which "I will make ..." (66:22)

While we indeed must wait to find out, perhaps our eternal home will be a restoration of what God intended for man when He created him and placed him in Eden. This thought is supported by the word which says that creation which was subjected to futility by reason of the fall "will be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation groans and labors with birth pangs together until now" (Romans 8:20-22). These words indicate that nature is waiting for deliverance at the end of time. The glorious liberty of the children of God is release from this earth and everything that oppresses us on the earth—our corrupt flesh, sin, death, and the devil. It is peace and compatibility with God in the fullest sense, as well as with all of God's children in heaven. Waiting for death and destruction does not seem compatible with nature's desire to be "delivered from the bondage of corruption." Will conditions of the restored heaven and earth be the ultimate fulfillment of the wolf and the lamb feeding together in Isaiah 65?

There are things we do know from the Word about heaven. There is much more that we do not know. The question of where heaven is intrigues us. Nevertheless, it is not important to know where heaven is. Time is better spent studying about and concentrating upon what the Bible says about how one gets to heaven.

What we know is that where God is we shall be. We know that righteousness will dwell in the new heavens and the new earth. We also know that those who died in unbelief and rejection of Christ will not be in the new heaven and the new earth. They will be on the outside looking in. Might that be part of the torment of hell? While we do not know how God will create the new heaven and the new earth, in which we shall dwell with Him, we do know that He knows, and that is enough for us.

Where it is, and what it will be pales in the Christian heart to actually being where our Father and the Savior are. What more need we know, or could we ask than to be with Him in whose presence is "fullness of joy" and at whose right hand "are pleasures forevermore" (Psalm 16:11) in the home "in which righteousness dwells" ?!
