Board of Education and Publications — Funding for various publishing projects, the CLC website, and for the work of the board in providing resources and encouragement in Christian education. The Board of Education and Publications oversees the synod's periodical magazines and the CLC Book House.

Additional Funds have been created to support various efforts in the CLC as offerings allow. None of your Mission offerings go to these funds, however, an offering can be designated for these funds at any time.

ILC Academic Center — The Academic Center was built with a 30 year mortgage. The monthly payment on the mortgage is \$7,984. Offerings to the Academic Center are applied to the mortgage. The mortgage balance is: \$1,261,301

Mission Development Fund (MDF) — This fund finances various extrabudgetary projects and aid efforts. Examples of MDF projects: Bibles for missions, translations, exploratory mission work, rice aid in India, bicycles, motorcycles, disaster relief.

Project Kinship — Project Kinship supports orphans in India, Nigeria, East Africa, Nepal as well as seminary students and pastors' widows.

Student Aid Fund (SAF) —This fund supports the grants, loans, and work -study offered to students at ILC in an effort to make the Christian education at ILC as affordable as possible.

ILC Improvement Fund (IIF) — These funds are used for larger maintenance and capital improvement projects on the ILC campus and its buildings.

Church Extension Fund (CEF) — These resources are loaned to congregations at low mortgage rates for building projects. Mortgage payments replenish the fund.

Regular reports on the work of the CLC appear in weekly bulletins to keep you aware of how our offerings are being used in these areas of God's Kingdom work among us.



CLC Coordinating Council Devotion

For a number of years now the local university (University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire) has used a running theme or slogan on its campus signs, official publications, and other forms of publicity. In its own right the theme is catchy—it's "The Power of AND." If I were to guess at an explanation of what is meant, it seems to indicate the goal of engaging UWEC faculty and students to become a successful part of a team effort working together to achieve common goals. Certainly in the secular world, in a corporate business environment, or at a medical facility, this way of thinking and operating makes sense.

However, if we were to adopt that kind of theme at Immanuel Lutheran College (ILC), it would be more than confusing; it would be completely false. In the spiritual area of our Christian identity and welfare, there is no such thing as the power of AND. It's always the power of ONE, beginning with the power of ONE for all. When it comes to the goal of our salvation in Christ, namely, the forgiveness of our sins and our hope of eternal life, Jesus does all the work for us, in our place. If it somehow turned into a power-of-AND situation (think work-righteousness or synergism), it would be doomed to fail, because we on our part would fail. Thankfully, the certainty of our salvation is firmly established by the power of ONE in our place, which is the foundational fact of the Gospel that we have come to know as believers in Christ.

Not only that, the power of ONE for us is also the power of ONE in us. The truth that Christ, in our place, has perfectly lived as our righteousness and vicariously died as the full atonement for all of our sins—that truth has been placed into our hearts by the Spirit. He has caused us to believe it, with the result that God continually lives in us by faith. We now confess as the apostle in Galatians 2: "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who

loved me and gave Himself for me" (Gal. 2:20). That same apostle also said regarding all who believe: "It is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure" (Phil. 2:13).

Even with our daily sanctification what appears to be a power of AND is still the power of ONE creating, sustaining, and strengthening our spiritual life so that we bear the fruits of faith that please Him. This power at work certainly applies to the efforts that we carry out and the goals that we seek here at Immanuel. Every day we need the power of ONE working for us, in us, and through us as teachers. We rely on the power of that same ONE working for the students, in the students, and through the students. With divine grace and might squarely on our side, the power of ONE can't be dismayed. Here at ILC Jesus brings to pass His promise among us: "Where two or three are gathered together in My name, there am I in the midst of them" (Matthew 18:20).

Personal growth in the grace and knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ is a primary goal for all the students at Immanuel, regardless of the department in which they are enrolled. This growth will not happen through the power of AND, but only through the power of ONE. The triune God causes it to be so for His children at Immanuel, and on that basis faculty, staff, and students lay claim to the apostle's declaration: "Of Him you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God and righteousness and sanctification and redemption—that, as it is written, 'He who glories, let him glory in the LORD'" (1 Corinthians 1:30).
