FAITHFUL EXERCISE OF FREEDOM OF RELIGION

Perhaps you did not know that there is an organization calling itself "Freedom from Religion Foundation." It describes itself as a group "working for separation of state and church...and to educate the public on matters relating to nontheism." In other words, it is an atheist organization. It is a charitable, tax exempt organization headquartered in Wisconsin that solicits gifts; however, the Better Business Bureau has raised a red flag. One of the flags is that it has not filed an "effectiveness report."

The Constitution of the United States guarantees freedom *of* religion. Freedom *from* religion is a product of the mind corrupted by sin. The founder of the organization, a woman, objected to legislators gathering in a room in the Wisconsin capitol to pray. Rather than praying, she said, they should get to work. Her reasoning is typical atheistic: "Nothing fails like prayer." ⁽¹⁾ We ought not be surprised at her assertion. Atheists have no one to whom to pray. Latter day Atheists are not original. Scripture says, "The fool has said in his heart 'There is no God'" (Psalm 14:1).

Atheists, though they claim to believe in no god, have a god. They are gods unto themselves. In their own mind, they are the determiners of what is right and wrong. While they acknowledge there are bad things in the world, by their assessment there is no sin. An atheist wrote: "As an atheist, since I do not believe in the existence of any supernatural being who will look after my moral wellbeing, there is no sin." Atheists, as well as evolutionists, do not accept that what moral conscience they do have, corrupted as it is since the fall, is a consequence of the natural law which was implanted in the heart by the God they deny.

The atheist will one day face the God he denies and receive the fearsome reward for his unbelief. Yet we who confess not only that there is a God, but that "the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Ghost is God, and yet they are not three Gods, but one God," (2) and that the Triune God is our Creator, our Redeemer, and our Sanctifier are wise to consider what Scripture says: "For to whom much is given, from him much will be required: and to whom much has been committed, of him they will ask the more" (Luke 12:48).

The passage from Luke speaks of the vigilance we are to have as we await the return of the Lord. When He knocks at our door, we are to be ready to go. "Blessed are those servants whom the master, when he comes, will find watching" (Luke 12:37). We who claim the Lord as our God are to be watching and, while watching, we are to be responsible members of the kingdom. Each day of our lives as children of God we are called to recognize the seriousness of the hour, for from the day of birth no one is guaranteed tomorrow. "The vigilant, responsible disciple will, unlike the unheeding multitudes" [the freedom from religion crowd], "be able to interpret ... the present time, to read the weather signals of God's approaching storm" (Luke 12::54-56).

Even among such as claim to believe in the Lord, it is unlikely they who *neglect* God in their life will be watching for the unknown hour at which time He will appear. Might the word of the Lord spoken of the betrayer be a warning to the neglectful? "It would have been better for that man if he had

not been born" (Matthew 26:24). While the degree of difference in judgment and eternal punishment for neglect and unbelief will not be noticeable by those suffering it, we leave to the Lord the ultimate meaning of the word He spoke to the impenitent cities of Chorazin and Bethsaida: "But it will be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon at the judgment than for you" (Luke 10:14).

The intent of our national constitution was not to *promote* freedom *from* religion, but to *protect* freedom *of* religion. To the present we are privileged and blessed to be able to practice our religion (our faith). For us the practice of freedom of religion is more than a nebulous, vague, acknowledgement of a god of many names and faces. We are privileged and blessed to learn of, and confess in word and in practice, the Triune God Who has created us, Who in love has freely redeemed us from sin and death and the power of the devil, and Who has called us to faith by the Spirit through the gospel. As Christianity is increasingly a target of wrath from those who hate it, we commit our freedom to practice our Christian religion (faith) to the Lord to protect it for us.

But the reality is that if we pray for the continued right to practice our faith, but do not practice what we believe and confess we place ourselves in jeopardy. The prophet Amos spoke of a famine "of hearing the words of the Lord," as well as an inability to find it if it departs (Amos 8:11-12). Blessings wasted or abused can be blessings lost.

Our Lord invites us, "Come, eat of my bread, and drink of the wine which I have mixed. Forsake foolishness and live, and go in the way of understanding" (Proverbs 9:5). Through the prophet Isaiah we are invited:

¹ "Ho! Everyone who thirsts, Come to the waters; And you who have no money, Come, buy and eat. Yes, come, buy wine and milk Without money and without price. ² Why do you spend money for *what is* not bread, And your wages for *what* does not satisfy? Listen carefully to Me, and eat *what is* good, And let your soul delight itself in abundance. ³ Incline your ear, and come to Me. Hear, and your soul shall live; And I will make an everlasting covenant with you-- The sure mercies of David. ⁴ Indeed I have given him *as* a witness to the people, A leader and commander for the people. ⁵ Surely you shall call a nation you do not know, And nations *who* do not know you shall run to you, Because of the LORD your God, And the Holy One of Israel; For He has glorified you." ⁶ Seek the LORD while He may be found, Call upon Him while He is near. ⁷ Let the wicked forsake his way, And the unrighteous man his thoughts; Let him return to the LORD, And He will have mercy on him; And to our God, For He will abundantly pardon. (Isaiah 55:1-7)

At this time of the year when we celebrate Thanksgiving, and enter into the season of Advent and contemplation of our Savior's birth and coming again, may our faith manifest itself in the face of the freedom from religion crowd, with an active joyful exercise of our right to freedom of religion, and practice of our faith. Until our Savior comes again to take the faithful to the heavenly home, drink deeply of the well of salvation (The Word of God) which dispenses forgiveness, peace, comfort, and hope, gifts from our Father through our Lord Jesus Christ—until He comes again to take the faithful to the heavenly home.
