Notes:

- * General Fund offerings in January totaled \$128,891 vs disbursements of \$86,830 Offerings for January increased the balance by \$42,000. The General Fund is supported by congregational offerings to the CLC Budget, which provides the basic monthly subsidy needed for the work of our Boards of Trustees, Missions, ILC, & Education/Publication. The budgeted needs of the General Fund is \$75,000/month.
- * ILC Building Projects offerings in January totaled \$13,838 (special gifts of \$4,700) vs disbursements of \$14,484, which included \$7,984 for the monthly CEF loan payment on the Academic Center (AC) and \$6,500 for the North Hall renovation project. The \$59,000 balance in the Building Projects Fund will draw down rather quickly in the next several months as the \$300,000 renovation project of the North Hall boys' dorm progresses. The Trustees maintain a 3-month buffer of \$24,000 in the Building Projects Fund for loan payments on the AC. Balances above the buffer will be used for North Hall renovation expenses until we have to borrow from the CEF.
- * MDF: offerings in January totaled \$17,237 vs disbursements of \$6,458, which included \$5,000 for Exploratory/Outreach in India, Africa, and Mexico.
- * SAF: received \$12,460 in offerings & student loans repaid (\$7,000) in January vs \$18,000 in new student loans & family discounts allocated to student accounts during the month. SAF had a shortfall of -\$3,800 for the month and needs an estimated \$37,000 for budgeted new student loans for the 2nd Semester.

DO NOT LOSE HEART

King Solomon said there is nothing new under the sun (Ecclesiastes 1:9). There is no new evil in the world; there is no time since the fall into sin that evil has not been present in the world. However, some may claim that the exercise of evil in our time is worse. That is hardly the case. Because of the evil in the world, the Lord sent the flood as judgment_(Genesis 7). By His grace, He spared Noah and his family (eight people) for the sake of His promise. Nevertheless, as we live in a specific era, we may feel that it has never been more evil than the time in which we live. For example, upon the recent election and its aftermath, *in our life time* we are hard pressed to remember such widespread visceral hatred *in our country* as we are seeing now. Morally ours is a country with the stench of Sodom and Gomorrah. It is sliding into anarchy and mob rule.

There was a time in this country when we prided ourselves in engaging in discussion of ideas, and adjudicating disagreements in court. Today civil discourse is diminished by the behavior of petty politicians and foul-mouth agitators. The concept of ideas and laws debated in the halls of government is sorely tried by the exercise of intimidation, threat, and mayhem, perpetrated by unruly mobs in the street.

This ought not surprise us. "But know this, that in the last days perilous times will come: For men will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, unloving, unforgiving, slanderers, without self-control, brutal, despisers of good, traitors, headstrong, haughty, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, having a form of godliness but denying its power. And from such people turn away" (2 Timothy 3:1-5)! We are living in the last times, the truth of which is mocked by those who love evil and are inviting the very judgment at which they laugh. When the Lord comes as a thief in the night (2 Peter 3:10) they who mock Him within the church as well as in the world "will utterly perish in their own corruption" (2 Peter 2:12).

This is the world in which the Church lives and works. Luther said, "Paul calls this present world evil because everything in it is subject to the malice of the devil who rules over the whole world as his domain and fills the air with ignorance, contempt, hatred and disobedience of God. In this devil's kingdom we live . . . The people of the world are the slaves of the devil" ^(*) Except that the Father Who desires the salvation of all has through Christ Jesus rescued Christ-believers from eternal death, the whole mass of humanity would be lost. As believers in the Lord Jesus Christ, we are distressed first at our own sin. "For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh) nothing good dwells, for to will is present with me, but how to perform what is good I do not find. For the good that I will to do I do not do; but the evil I will not to do, that I practice" (Romans 7:18-19) ... O wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death? I thank God — through Jesus Christ our Lord ..." (Romans 7:24-25). Our hope lies in the Lord Jesus Christ Who in His mercy atoned for our sin, and Who by His Spirit called us to faith in Him and His atonement. This is the comfort and strength of the child of God in time and for eternity. Do not lose heart. Whoever believes in the Savior shall not perish but *has* everlasting life.

The confident hope of Christ-believers is one impenitent workers of iniquity will never have. Scripture paints a grim and ugly picture of those who love sin and live in rejection of Christ. They are like "A dog [who]returns to his own vomit, and a sow [which] having washed, [returns] to her wallowing in the mire" (2 Peter 2:21-22). The impenitent choke on their own vomit, and die in their filth. They shall receive the due reward of their evil in the judgment. Unless they repent they will be numbered among those of whom it is said, "Therefore, the ungodly shall not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous. For the Lord knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the ungodly shall perish" (Psalm 2:5-6).

Of the evil world Scripture further says, "Why do the nations rage, and the people plot a vain thing? The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the Lord and against His Anointed [Christ], *saying*, "Let us break Their bonds in pieces and cast away Their cords from us" (Psalm 2:1-3). The nations of the world reject joyful service to the Lord of Life, and choose slavery to sin and the prince of death. Inasmuch as children of God through faith in Christ are members of the body of Christ, we too are rejected by the world for preaching repentance and proclaiming Christ. But, "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand. Behold, all those who were incensed against you, shall be ashamed and disgraced; they shall be as nothing, and those who strive with you shall perish ... For I the Lord your God, will hold your right hand, saying to you, Fear not, I will help you" (Isaiah 41:10-13). The eternal morning will be the end of all sorrow endured in this world.

As relates to our present country of citizenship, Christ-believers will pray for those in authority. We will ask the Lord for godly leaders who respect and search out His will. We will implore Him to stem the evil and restore the exercise of respect and civility in our land. In seeking His grace of forgiveness for our own sins, we will pray that other hearts will be turned in repentance to Him. We will pray for peace and order that the gospel may freely be preached to the joy and edifying of God's people. But that prayer carries with it the responsibility to live our faith, and to faithfully witness to the world through faithful preaching of law and gospel. The reality is that without the Spirit Who works in hearts through the Word there will be no repentance. It serves no purpose, therefore, to lament the state of affairs unless we are also ready to declare the Word so the Spirit can work.

In the meantime, we wait with patience for the return of our Lord. In spite of what tribulations we must suffer in body, or what sorrow or apprehension we feel as we view the wickedness around us, we join with David in saying, "In You, O Lord, I put my trust; Let me never be ashamed; deliver me in Your righteousness. Bow down Your ear to me, deliver me speedily; be my rock of refuge, a fortress of defense to save me" (Psalm 31:1-2).

Whether it be for the time we have left here or for our hope of heaven, the blessed country of God's elect, our Lord already has the answer to our prayer, "For the mountain shall depart and the hills be removed, but My kindness shall not depart from you, nor shall My covenant of peace be removed, says the Lord Who has mercy on you" (Isaiah 54:10). As you hope in the Heavenly Father and in the Lord Jesus Christ, do not lose heart. His will is done on earth and it is always good! Further, His will for our eternal welfare was clearly declared when He offered up Jesus upon the cross for us, as well as when He brought us to faith. Absolutely do not lose heart. There is nothing new under the sun. Of the Lord who said, "Yes, I have loved you with an everlasting love . . ." (Jeremiah 31:3), we are told "The Lord takes pleasure in those who fear Him, in those who hope in His mercy" (Psalm 147:11). In time, and for eternity!
