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THE ETERNAL SANCTUARY CITY

We are hearing more and more of sanctuary cities in the whole immigration brou-ha-ha in this country. It appears the issue is and will continue to be a source of irritation and political grandstanding for some time to come.

The concept of a sanctuary city is found in Christian history. Jesus had prophesied the destruction of Jerusalem (Luke 23:28-31). In AD 65, the Romans threatened the city. They retreated in the face of a Jewish rebellion. Under another Roman leader, the Romans regrouped and advanced on Jerusalem. Of this occurrence, Josephus (37-100), the Jewish historian (not a Christian) says, "without any reason in the world" Cestius withdrew his troops and departed." At this occurrence believers fled Jerusalem. Eusebius (325), the Greek historian and Christian polemicist wrote, "But the people of the church in Jerusalem had been commanded by a revelation, vouchsafed to approved men there before the war, to leave the city and to dwell in a certain town of Perea called Pella." (History of the Church 3:5:3) ... "The whole body, however, of the church at Jerusalem, having been commanded by a divine revelation, given to men of approved piety there before the war, removed from the city, and dwelt at a certain town beyond the Jordan, called Pella. ... For when the city was about to be captured and sacked by the Romans, all the disciples were warned beforehand by an angel to remove from the city." Christ's prophecy came to pass in AD 70. The marvelous escape of the Christians occurred by the grace and direction of the Lord.

In light of today's sanctuary city debate, we are interested in the spiritual application of the concept, one far removed from the distortion of politics and pious do-goodism. We look at it from three Scriptural perspectives.

Eden was the perfect home created for Adam and Eve by God who interacted with Adam and Eve within it. As there was no defilement in Eden, we cannot begin to comprehend the beauty of it. Perhaps even more difficult to comprehend is the love and grace of God that moved Him to rescue Adam and Eve and their offspring from the consequences of their sin that ruined them and robbed them of their garden paradise.

The Father by promise and ultimately by fulfillment promised them safety. It was in the arms of the Savior Jesus Christ, Who through His suffering and death in the sinner's place endured sin's consequence, and by His resurrection restored life. The Lord Jesus reconciled mankind to the Father. He restored peace between the offenders and the Offended. Furthermore, by His Spirit He brought us to faith, promising that there is now no condemnation to them that are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit (Romans 8:1).

The Spirit invites us day by day to find security, safety, and peace in the Savior. "Our Savior Jesus Christ ... has abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel" (2 Timothy 1:10).

"Come to Me, all you who labor and are heaven laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (Matthew 11:28).

"The Lord *is* my shepherd; I shall not want. He makes me to lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside the still waters. He restores my soul; He leads me in the paths of righteousness For His name's sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; for You *are* with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; You anoint my head with oil; my cup runs over. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life; and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever" (Psalm 23).

"The name of the Lord is a strong tower; the righteous run to it and are safe" $_{(Proverbs\ 18:10)}$.

Our blessed Savior is our sanctuary, our place of safety, our defense from the stormy blasts. The risen Lord says, "Peace I leave with you, My

peace I give to you. ... Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid" (John 14:27).

Sanctuary, in its original meaning, is a sacred place. By extension the term has come to be used for



any place of safety. Consequently, Christ-believers delight to be where peace, rest, and security are found. For daily life in this darkened and fallen world we have a place of security. We have it each time we read the Word of our Lord. Each Sunday and in each worship service as we gather around the Word and Sacrament, we are blessed with peace, rest, and security.

"I was glad when they said to me, 'let us go into the house of the Lord" $_{(\mbox{\footnotesize{Psalm 122:1}}).}$

"Lord, I have loved the habitation of Your house, and the place where Your glory dwells" (Psalm 26:8).

"For a day in Your courts is better than a thousand. I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than dwell in the tents of wickedness" (Psalm 84:10).

"Then Jacob woke from his sleep and said, 'Surely the Lord is in this place and, I did not know it.' And he was afraid and said, 'How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven" (Genesis 28:16-17).

Upon Jacob's flight from Esau he had an encounter with the Lord. The place where had his dream of the ladder that reached to heaven, at the top of which was the Lord, he called Bethel (House of God). Being in the house of God where the Lord speaks to us through His gospel Word, we can for that moment, at least, shut out the raucous noise and ugly racket, as well as the vulgarity of the world. Immersed in the Word of God we are in a safe place. Christ-believers who recognize that there is no real peace and no abiding happiness without Christ, are thankful for the opportunity to draw near to God Who promises to draw near to them (James 4:8). Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord" (2 Timothy 1:2).

We find peace, rest, and security in Christ, the living Word and in His house where He speaks to us and hears our prayers. "Blessed are those who hear the Word of God and keep it" (Luke 11:28). How blessed we are to have the promise, ""My Presence will go with you, and I will give you rest" (Exodus 33:14). "The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make His face shine upon you, and be gracious to you; The Lord lift up His countenance upon you, and give you peace" (Numbers 6: 24-26).

The peace, rest, and security that we have in Christ now, and in His house "which is the gate of heaven" where His Word is taught is but a precursor of the eternal and undisturbed peace, rest, and security that every Christ-believer will have in heaven.

"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal; but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal" (Matthew 6:19-20).

"There remains therefore a rest for the people of God" $_{(Hebrews\ 4:9)}$ -

"Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on. Yes, says the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors" (Revelation 14:13).

"Come, you blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" (Matthew 25:34).

"And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes: there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying. There shall be no more pain, for the former things have passed away" (Revelation 21:4). "There shall by no means enter it anything that defiles, or causes an abomination or a lie, but only those who are written in the Lamb's Book of Life" (Revelation 21:27).

So, shall we ever be with the Lord. Home at last. At peace. At rest. Secure. In heaven, the eternal sanctuary city.
