

CLC President's Letter – March 2017

Dear fellow servants of the One who suffered death for all:

Why spend days driving cross country when you could fly and be at your destination within a few hours? In spite of the obvious advantages to flying, my wife and I at times have opted to make lengthy trips by car. We have discovered the truth to the saying: "It's not just the destination, but the journey." We have come to appreciate hours on the road as time to talk and reconnect without interruption. Driving allows one to take in changing scenery, visit unique towns along the way, and meet new people. You come away with a better understanding of your destination when you have experienced the route it took to get there.

The Lenten season is like that. It is the journey to a destination. It is the opportunity to spend hours with fellow believers on Sundays and hopefully Wednesdays, as well, in walking with Jesus as He "set His face" to go to Jerusalem. He refused to be sidetracked. He was determined to fulfill what He had prophesied through Isaiah: "Therefore have I set my face like flint, and I know I will not be put to shame" (Is. 50:7). Jesus would let

nothing deter Him from the cross which awaited Him.

After many years of Lenten preaching, it might seem as though it's all been said before and that perhaps the "journey" has been made so often that one can skip right to the destination. But the reality is that it is needed now more than ever. Our world does not know what to make of Jesus' cross. All it sees is the brutal execution of a man it views as merely a kind, loving teacher. Commemorating Jesus' suffering seems a dark, morbid activity. Sadly, even some so-called Christian churches avoid the "uncomfortable" cross to focus on a general feel-good message of love and tolerance for all.

The journey of Lent provides the context to grasp and appreciate the true meaning of the cross. It is not an unexpected, abrupt end to a promising life. It's just the opposite. This is why the Son of God was born into the world. It is the fulfillment of a promise made to Adam and Eve of the Seed who would crush the serpent's head, reconcile the world to the holy God, defeat death, and open heaven to sinners.

Take the opportunity this season to ponder and appreciate the journey. There's no better time for personal reflection and repentance. Remember why Jesus was so determined to go to Jerusalem. He loves you and wanted to take the burden of all your guilt and shortcomings

upon Himself. Follow David's example and pray: "I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, 'I will confess my transgressions to the LORD." The journey of repentance leads to the relief and joy of the destination: "You forgave the guilt of my sin" (Ps. 32:5). "But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed" (Is. 53:5).

One drawback to a long road trip is that you may arrive weary from the trip. The Lenten journey has the opposite effect. It brings us to the cross filled with hope and anticipation for what comes next! May the Spirit bless the journey ahead.
