Welcome to our Festival Easter Service. Easter is one of the oldest of the Christian festivals and the most joyous to all those who are well grounded in faith and the knowledge of Jesus Christ. The Christians of apostolic times were often in

sadness because they were repeatedly persecuted and in danger of losing their life. But on Easter Day they lifted up their heads; then they exhibited the air of triumph; they embraced each other, crying out to one another, "The Lord is Risen! He is Risen indeed!" This is the most blessed news in all the Gospel. He Who bled for our sins, Who for our guilt was laid in the tomb, cold and dead, He is risen from the dead. He is risen indeed and lives to die no more.



This is the true source of Christian joy supported by the very time of His resurrection. He was born in the night; in the night He was taken captive. When the sun was hiding in darkness He yielded up His soul. But when the sun was rising in the east, and a golden red hue painted the Eastern sky chasing away the shadows of night, then He broke forth from the grave. He threw off the shackles of death. He, the Son of Righteousness, arose with healing in His wings. The power of darkness and earth was broken. Christ was the Victor!

S.S. Children's Reading:Mark 16:1-8: The Resurrection Account



Now when the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary *the mother* of James, and Salome bought spices, that they might come and anoint Him. Very early in the morning, on the first *day* of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. And they said among themselves, "Who will roll away the stone from the door of the tomb for us?" But when they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away; for it was very large. And entering the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a long white robe sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him. But go, tell His disciples; and Peter; that He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him, as He said to you." So they went out quickly and fled from the tomb, for they trembled and were amazed. And they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.



First Reading:John 20:1-9

(1) Now on the first day of the week Mary Magdalene went to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. (2) Then she ran and came to Simon Peter, and to the other disciple, whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken away the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid Him." (3) Peter therefore went out, and the other disciple, and were going to the tomb. (4) So they both ran together, and the other disciple outran Peter and came to the tomb first. (5) And he, stooping down and looking in, saw the linen cloths lying there; yet he did not go in. (6) Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb; and he saw the linen cloths lying there, (7) and the handkerchief that had been around His head, not lying with the linen cloths, but folded together in a place by itself. (8) Then the other disciple, who came to the tomb first, went in also; and he saw and believed. (9) For as vet they did not know the Scripture, that He must rise again from the dead.

SING: Jesus lives! To Him my heart Draws with ever new delight. Earthly vanities, depart, Hinder not my heavenward flight. Let this spirit ever rise To its magnet in the skies.



Second Reading:John 20:10-18

(10) Then the disciples went away again to their own homes. (11) But Mary stood outside by the tomb weeping, and as she wept she stooped down and looked into the tomb. (12) And she saw two angels in white sitting, one at the head and the other at the feet, where the body of Jesus had lain. (13) Then they said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "Because they have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid Him." (14) Now when she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, and did not know that it was Jesus. (15) Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?" She, supposing Him to be the gardener, said to Him, "Sir, if You have carried Him away, tell me where You have laid Him, and I will take Him away." (16) Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to Him, "Rabboni!" (which is to say, Teacher). (17) Jesus said to her, "Do not cling to Me, for I have not yet ascended to My Father; but go to My brethren and say to them, 'I am ascending to My Father and your Father, and to My God and your God." (18) Mary Magdalene came and told the disciples that she had seen the Lord, and that He had spoken these things to her.

SING: Jesus lives! Why weepest thou? Why that sad and frequent sigh? He who died our Brother here Lives our Brother still on high, Lives forever to bestow **Blessings on His Church below.**

(19) Then, the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them, "Peace be with you." (20) When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord.

SING: Hallelujah, angels sing! Join us in our hymn of praise; Let your chorus swell the strain Which our feebler voices raise: Glory to our God above And on earth His peace and love!

(1) What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound? (2) Certainly not! How shall we who died to sin live any longer in it? (3) Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? (4) Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. (5) For if we have been united together in the likeness of His death, certainly we also shall be in the likeness of His resurrection, (6) knowing this, that our old man was crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin. (7) For he who has died has been freed from sin. (8) Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him, (9) knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, dies no more. Death no longer has dominion over Him. (10) For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all; but the life that He lives, He lives to God. (11) Likewise you also, reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Easter Sermon: Ephesians 1:15-23 (15) Therefore I also, after I heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints, (16) do not cease to give thanks for you, making mention of you in my prayers: (17) that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give to you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him, (18) the eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that you may know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, (19) and what is the exceeding greatness of His power toward us who believe, according to the working of His mighty power (20) which He worked in Christ when He raised Him from the dead and seated *Him* at His right

hand in the heavenly places, (21) far above all principality and power and might and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in that which is to come. Lord Jesus Christ, the Father's Son, Who came to earth to save mankind, You perfectly fulfilled His will And saved us from our sin and shame. On this most precious holy day We worship You with joyful heart For you Who died have ris'n again.



Faith believes what reason cannot comprehend. "Faith is the substance [confidence, assurance] of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen" (Hebrews 11:1). Luther said that faith does not explore the why and wherefore, and we would add the how, of what God has done. Faith trusts the word and promise of the Lord God.

The church properly speaking is the sum of all believers in the Lord Jesus Christ through time. The union between Christ and the church is summed up succinctly in Scripture which says, "Christ is the head of the body, the Church ... (Colossians 1:18). Consequently when Jesus, the head, died on the cross so did the body, the church. Too deep to comprehend? Ask yourself, "Can a head die and the body live?" Not possible. Therefore believers through faith in Jesus died when He died. By the same token, "Can the head rise, and leave its members dead?" As believers died with Christ, likewise as members of His body they have also risen with Him. Too deep for us. We freely and unapologetically acknowledge that we are content to take the Lord at His word, and do not delve into the secret things of God. Nevertheless, what we believe is further confirmed in Scripture.

Colossians speaks of our being "buried with Him in baptism, in which you were also raised with Him through faith in the working of God Who raised Him from the dead" (Colossians 2:12). We believe Romans 6: "Do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. For if we have been united together in the likeness of His death, certainly we also shall be *in the likeness* of His resurrection, knowing this, that our old man was crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin" (Romans 6:3-6). The reality of our union with Christ is the reality of blessings beyond measure, blessings to be enjoyed now while we wait for the regenerated being within us to put off the crate in which we are still packaged while we are on the earth. But death, the last enemy that confronts us, cannot hold us; for every believer in the Lord Jesus it has been turned into a plus, for it is the means of release from this evil world to the perfect life in heaven. As death has no dominion over Christ it has no dominion over us in that we are risen with Him. Jesus said, "And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die" (John 11:26). As one sainted professor said, "I don't plan to die."

We are the body, You the Head, So as You died, we died with You. And as You've risen from the dead We also are alive with You. The evil foe can harm us none, As now we wait for Your return To take us to our promised Home. By our relationship to Christ sin no longer has dominion over us, that is, we are *not slaves* to sin. Crucified with Christ in baptism, we have been freed from sin (Romans 6:7). "The life that follows upon our death in baptism is a life of a new kind." ⁽¹⁾ The new life is manifested by walking in the newness of life that is reflective of the risen Christ with whom we have risen and overcome death. Yes, though free from *slavery* to sin we still sin because we are in the flesh; however, the Christ-believer does not delight in sin, but repents of it.

Help us, O Lord, to live the life That shuns the evil we detest. For as we are alive in you We are no longer slaves to sin. May ever now our words and life Reflect your love and grace to us, In thankful adoration.

From the cross of Calvary and the empty tomb flow riches in such measure that we can hardly contain them all, much less explain them to the satisfaction of our corrupted reason.

Martin Franzmann wrote: "The reality of Christ's death and resurrection determines our whole existence; the controlling reality of our life now is the fact that we *shall* live. Our present life gets its character, direction, and purpose from the fact that we shall live with Him who lives a life beyond death, a life lived wholly to God, now that He has died an atoning death, once for all, to sin." ⁽²⁾ Christ bore our sin and died, but never again. As He has united Himself to us and us to Him, in Him we are dead to sin because He died to sin. No longer does the believer live to sin, but he lives to God (Romans 6:9-11).

Christ has already paid our debt, and overcome our enemies, sin, death and the devil, and has made us participants in His victory since He has by His Spirit made each of us a member of His body. We believe what we cannot comprehend. It's called faith. "If then you were raised with Christ, seek those things which are above …" (Colossians 3:1). "Blessed are those who have not seen, but yet have believed" (John 20:29).

O, Christ the Lord who's ris'n indeed, Who's reconciled us to God. We thank You for the present joy And future bliss that now is ours. May we forever and again, Sing praise to you our Savior dear. O, keep us in the faith and sure. ⁽³⁾

"Now may the God of peace who brought up our Lord Jesus from the dead, that great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, make you complete in every good work to do His will, working in you what is well pleasing in His sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom *be* glory forever and ever. 
