Now when they had passed through Amphipolis and Apollonia, they came to Thessalonica, where there was a synagogue of the Jews. ² Then Paul, as his custom was, went in to them, and for three Sabbaths reasoned with them from the Scriptures, explaining and demonstrating that the Christ had to suffer and rise again from the dead, and saying, "This Jesus whom I preach to you is the Christ." ⁴ And some of them were persuaded; and a great multitude of the devout Greeks, and not a few of the leading women, joined Paul and Silas. ⁵ But the Jews who were not persuaded, becoming envious, took some of the evil men from the marketplace, and gathering a mob, set all the city in an uproar and attacked the house of Jason, and sought to bring them out to the people. ⁶ But when they did not find them, they dragged Jason and some brethren to the rulers of the city, crying out, "These who have turned the world upside down have come here too. ⁷ "Jason has harbored them, and these are all acting contrary to the decrees of Caesar, saying there is another king.— Jesus." ⁸ And they troubled the crowd and the rulers of the city when they heard these things. ⁹ So when they had taken security from Jason and the rest, they let them go. ¹⁰ Then the brethren immediately sent Paul and Silas away by night to Berea. When they arrived, they went into the synagogue of the Jews. ¹¹ These were more fair-minded than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness, and searched the Scriptures daily to find out whether these things were so. ¹² Therefore many of them believed, and also not a few of the Greeks, prominent women as well as men. (NKIV).

CLC E-Devotion – Saturday, July 5, 2014

Matthew 18:1-4 At that time the disciples came to Jesus and asked, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" He called a little child and had him stand among them. And he said: "I tell you the truth, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.

HUMBLY TRUST HIS WORD

One of the characteristics of little children is that they believe what their parents say to them. I know with my daughters I have to be very careful when they ask me questions because whatever answers I give them, they will believe and accept them as the truth. If one asks, "Daddy, how come ..." then I had



better make sure I know "how come" before I say something!

As we get older, the devil challenges our child-like trust in Jesus. As adults, those things we learned in Sunday School and youth Bible classes can begin to seem too "childish" to us. Our "grown up" minds don't appreciate so well the simple gospel of salvation by faith for Christ's sake. We can become proud, thinking that we know better than what God tells us. And so people have wandered away from the simple truths of the good news of Jesus. They have looked for other ways of salvation and happiness--to the destruction of their souls.

God reminds us to be child-like in the way we treat the things He says to us--to accept them as the truth without question! Jesus said to His disciples: "Unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." There are times to be skeptical--like when you're watching an infomercial on television. But when the Lord says: "You are forgiven. I will take you to heaven to be with me. I will help you through your earthly struggles and sorrows," that is not a time to question or doubt Him. That is the time to believe like little children.

A simple, child-like faith in your Savior is not a sign of weakness. It does not mean you are simple-minded or lacking in intelligence. It means that the Holy Spirit has worked in you, for no one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit (1 Cor 12:3). Continue to stand up for your faith; to be confident in what God says because His word is truth.

- * General Fund offerings in April totaled \$76,218 vs disbursements of \$68,477. The budgeted need of the General Fund is \$75,000/month. The General Fund balance improved by \$7,700 in April. The General Fund is supported by congregational offerings to the CBP Budget, which provides the basic monthly subsidy needed for the work of our Boards of Trustees, Missions, ILC, & Education/Publication.
- * ILC Building Projects offerings in April totaled \$4,605 vs disbursements of \$7,984, which is the monthly CEF loan payment on the Academic Center (AC). The \$46,301 balance in the Building Projects Fund will draw down quickly as the \$300,000 renovation project of the North Hall boys' dorm moves quickly with school recessed for the summer. The Trustees maintain a 3-month buffer of \$24,000 in the Building Projects Fund to assure loan payments on the AC. Balances above the buffer will draw down for North Hall renovation expenses until the need to borrow from the Church Extension Fund.
- MDF: offerings in April totaled \$8,132 vs disbursements of \$2,674, improving the balance by \$5,400.
- * SAF: received \$32,345 in April from offerings (\$22,129) and student loans repaid (\$10,215) vs disbursements of \$10,303 in student loans & family discounts allocated to student accounts for the 2nd semester. The SAF has a balance of \$28,410 and will use \$10,000 of that for student loans & grants for the last month of the 2nd Semester. The SAF budget for the next school year is \$160,000, to provide student loans (\$80,000), multi-student discounts, grants, & scholarships (\$54,000), & other expenses.
- * Reserve Fund: several corrections were made during the year to produce the corrected balance above.

If anyone is interested, or knows anyone in the CLC who might be interested in serving the Lord in this manner, please let the Board of Education (Chad Hestekin, James Bomber, Michael Ude) or Pastor know. On Wednesday, May 24, after the school play, Ann Radichel will be recognized for her retirement from teaching in our school. Special thanks to Ann for her years of service at our school!
- ◆ Grace Lutheran School staff is planning for the 2017-18 school year. If you are interested in enrolling your child in our school, please speak to one of the teachers for an enrollment form.
- ◆ Confirmation: Next Sunday is Confirmation of Kathleen Baker. She has been putting in considerable time to prepare for her public exam which will be at 9 am in the sanctuary.
