Voters Meeting Notes – October 15, 2017

Meeting was opened with prayer. The July voter meeting minutes were approved as amended. The 3rd quarter treasurer's report was approved.

Pastor's Report

- VBS in July totaled 50 children, 29 being non-members.
- Catechism has 7 students in our Christian Day School and 4 public students.
- Grace hosted the Minnesota Pastoral Conference Oct. 3-4, and all went well.
- The pulpit rotation for Reformation is going well.
- Pastor Hein and Missionary Koenig will be visiting Liberia November 7-25.
- Motion passed to honor Lyle Trulin's request to be removed from membership.

Board of Elders Report

- Mission Festival has been moved to November 26.
- Grace has offered to host the 2018 MN delegate conference, but that has not yet been finalized. The conference will be held on a Saturday in June, and there will not be any in September.

Board of Trustees Report

- All repair work on the roof is completed. The total was just under \$109,000.
- The copier has been causing some problems lately and is being looked at.

Board of Education Report

- There are currently 21 students attending Grace Lutheran School. Teaching staff and classroom structure are at a maximum as currently set up. Much discussion followed.
- Motion passed to change Ellen Radichel's call from ½ time to ¾ time for the 2017/2018 school year.
- Motion passed to have two full time teachers with individual classrooms starting in the 2018/2019 school year.
- Motion passed to include kindergarten starting the 2018/2019 school year.
- Motion passed to increase non-member tuition by \$500 for the 2018/2019 school year to \$1700 and to increase non-member tuition by \$500 for the 2019/2020 school year to \$2200.
- Motion passed to include multi-student discounts for non-members per an attached chart.

Other Business

• The Elders proposed a 3% increase in Pastor's salary. The Board of Education proposed a 3% increase in teacher salaries and an increase in retirement. Motion passed to accept the following 2018 budget:
