Exploratory Trip to Guinea

If you would, please include Pastor Joseph Kwiwalazu in your prayers as he travels into Guinea.

On the last phase of my trip in November a team of four of us traveled to the northern most area of Liberia, Lofa County. Pastor Joseph brought me to the border of Guinea, at Yealla Town, where we had been granted permission to cross over. We visited with border agents and exchanged pleasantries. Since I was at a remote crossing, they were quite pleased that I would be interested in talking with them. I told them I was thankful that I could tell people in my home country that I had been able to visit their country on what was Thanksgiving Day here in the USA.

Pastor Joseph was excited that the crossing had gone so smoothly, so much so that he spoke relentlessly about how he prayed that we would be able to conduct mission work in Guinea. He had two reasons: 1) there are a number of Liberian refugees there, and 2) the country has an 85% Muslim population. He said we needed to pray that the Lord would lead us to a man who was both English and French speaking.

So what happens? On our way back to Monrovia on my last day in Liberia, our vehicle had a breakdown in a remote area a few hours from the nearest town with a taxi. After about an hour of attempting a repair, we had to try to figure out how to get at least me to Monrovia to make my flight. Just as we start figuring out plans, a villager cried out, "Another white man! Another white man!" An Australian in a small SUV drove up.

After my team made arrangements with this man I got into the vehicle and he introduced himself to me as Michael Fields. Joseph got in the back seat with the equivalent of what would be this man's assistant. Wilson Veh. The trip to the next town with a taxi was quite eventful as the vehicle was filled with conversation. These men were Lutherans who were working with refugees and were having corruption problems with the Liberian equivalent of the LC-MS and the ELCA. As a result they were quite interested in us and what we were doing. Wilson was fairly well educated on differences among USA Lutherans. They were surprised to learn that we were confessional Lutherans who were interested in teaching the truth of God's Word.

Wilson has been trying to put us in contact with various people ever since. One set of contacts that he has is in Nzerekore, Guinea, in particular a Liberian refugee named Christian T. Sannah who is both English and French speaking. After various correspondences, the Board of Missions is permitting Pastor Joseph to take a trip to Guinea to meet with these people. He plans to travel this week, from February 21st to the 26th.

Please keep Pastor Joseph in your prayers as the Lord leads him on this trip!

Luke 22:42 Then He said to them, "My soul is exceedingly sorrowful, even to death."

OVERWHELMED

Even when we consider the fact that the destruction meant for sinful flesh was bearing down on Jesus' sinless humanity we still might question why our Lord should be so overwhelmed at the prospect of dying. Haven't numerous martyrs faced excruciating torture and a shameful death without sigh or shudder-- through faith in Jesus' name? Was Christ less courageous than they?

Hardly. Jesus' death was far different than that of brave believers martyred for their faith. Christ's crucifixion took the sting out of the martyrs' deaths. With sin's curse gone they knew death had been transformed from a wall into a door-- a door opening into eternal joy at Jesus' side. But in Gethsemane Christ looks forward to dying under sin's full curse, its sting not diminished but multiplied countless times over. He was to taste the bitter dregs of sin's curse not once, but



thousands upon thousands of times. He was going to the cross in the place of every sinner ever. The sin and the guilt, the punishment, due the whole world was bearing down on Him.

In the darkness of Gethsemane Jesus was not in agony for fear of mental or physical suffering to come but because of the spiritual suffering that awaited Him and the spiritual death. The horror of hell-that was what caused Jesus' agony of soul in the Garden. It was not dread of dying but of Death itself. Death as separation from God. Death, the final penalty for all of the accumulated guilt of humanity from Adam to the last person yet to be born.

Christ, the Life of all the living, Christ, the Death of death, our foe, Who, Thyself for me once giving To the darkest depths of woe, Through thy sufferings, death, and merit I eternal life inherit: Thousand, thousand thanks shall be, Dearest Jesus, unto Thee.
