THE BOOK OF BOOKS

GQ (formerly Gentlemen's Quarterly), an international men's magazine addresses a wide range of subjects including fashion, style, and culture for men, articles on food, movies, fitness, sex, music, travel, sports. Apparently, it also sees itself as an authority on the Bible. According to USA Today (4/23/18) GQ recently declared the Bible to be one of the most overrated books of all time. The magazine ranks the Bible number 12 on a list of 21 books, "You don't have to read." The article states, "Those who have read it know there are some good parts, but overall it is certainly not the finest thing that man has ever produced. It is repetitive, self-contradictory, sententious [sanctimonious, contentious], foolish, and even at times ill-intentioned."

Such mockery is as old as unbelief. Paul wrote, "For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing ..." (1 Corinthians 1:18).

We do not have to, and we do not intend to, prove to the deniers of the Holy God, or His Word, that the Bible is the most important Book in the history of the world, much less will we resort to scientific means, or other human endeavors to make the point. The Bible stands on its own authority, and through the power of the Word itself converts hearts, bears witness to its authorship, its truth, its authenticity, its authority, its power, and its blessings.



We will not respond by appealing to reason, or even to the fact that the Bible is the most widely sold and read (we are told) book in history. To those who want proof, we simply say, "Lay aside your bias and study Scripture."

The premise that the Bible is not the "finest thing that man has ever produced" is true, not in the sense Bible deniers mean it, but from a Christian perspective. The Bible is not a human production. No such claim is made. Man is not the author of the Bible or of any part thereof. God is the Author. "... No prophecy of Scripture is of any private interpretation, for prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit" (1 Peter 1:21). "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God [is God-breathed] ..." (2 Timothy 3:16). The erudite apostle Paul could have passed himself off as a writer par excellence. He did not but gave the Holy Spirit credit. "These things we also speak, not in word's which man's wisdom teaches, but which the Holy Spirit teaches ..." (1 Corinthians 2:13).

Can we prove it? Not to the skeptic or denier of God. We simply say, "Lay aside your bias and study Scripture."

The Bible is offensive to many, but only to those who do not like what it says about the human condition and that they have been affected with the sin of Adam from their conception. No person caters to being told that he is a sinner, that he is not as good as he thinks he is, or that he is corrupt, and nothing more than what Luther called himself, a "maggot sack." Furthermore, that day by day he sins in thought, word and deed, because "the imagination of man's heart is evil from his youth" (Genesis 8:21). "All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23). The Bible offends those who deny sin in their life, and even more that "He that commits sin is of the devil ... (1 John 3:3), and further that "He who does not believe will be condemned" (Mark 10:16).

So what is their reaction? To their own destruction mockers deny that the Bible is truth. They accuse it of being sanctimonious, judgmental, foolish, self-contradictory, and without value. Deniers of God and Scripture are gods unto themselves who do what is right in their own eyes, and then wonder why they can't fix what they have messed up, if in fact they recognize what is wrong. They call evil good, and good evil, and castigate those who dare to tell them the truth.

They reject the Bible but have nothing to put in its place. They have no concept of prophecy which God repeated many times and in many ways and whose every action prepared the Old Testament people for the coming of the incarnate Son of God Who would take away the sins of the world, even those sins which they will not admit. They are without hope in the world and have no concept of the horrendous judgment that awaits them at the Lord's return. Seeing no value in the Bible, they have no concept of the Gospel which Paul called, "the power of God unto salvation." The birth of the incarnate Son of God, the promise of a Savior from sin (which they will not acknowledge), the judgment of the world when the Lord will condemn the ungodly and bring to glory those who believe in Christ Jesus are idle tales, repetitious, self-contradictory, foolish. They mock and ridicule the word which speaks God's mercy and longsuffering because He desires not the death of the wicked, but that the wicked turn from wickedness to repentance and faith.

They will not acknowledge the reality of God and His control of the world. They cannot and will not acknowledge the love of God whose very existence is foolishness to them. Since they reject the depth of the love of God seen at the cross, declared at the cross, and confirmed by the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, there is nothing else in the world that will change their dead heart.

Post-conversion evidence can confirm the love of God to believers who know the love of God in Christ—for example, His providential care of men and nations—but nothing except the revelation of God's love in Christ can convert the heart. What then can we do? We who, "in Christ Jesus" have

been born again (1 Corinthians 4:15), "not of corruptible seed but incorruptible, through the Word of God which lives and abides forever" (1 Peter 1: 23), can faithfully fulfill the divine commission to preach the Gospel. We can invite doubters to "Come and hear," for "Faith comes by hearing ..." (Romans 10:17.)

The Bible has no value? So how is the world's Bible-less, Christ-less approach working in a world spinning out of control, and in which morality is a bad word, and self-aggrandizement and pride have seized the heart? That Christ-believers having the same natural flesh as the ungodly fight daily against sin does not change the fact--the power unto sanctified living to the glory of God is born of the Gospel recorded in the Book the mockers reject.

The Bible has no value? It is God's inspired Word which is "profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness" (2 Timothy 3:16). There is nothing else in the world equal to the Scriptures. There is no understanding of the Bible without the work of Holy Spirit Who through the Law convicts the sinner and through the Gospel works saving faith and the sanctified life. Ultimately it is the Word of God itself which converts hearts, bears witness to its authorship, its truth, its authenticity, its authority, its power, and its blessings.

God help us to live in the joy of forgiveness, reflecting His truth and love by our confession of faith in word and deed before the mocker and doubter as we invite them to "Come and see. Read it. Study Scripture."

Suffice it to say in response to *GQ* and others of that ilk: There is one consistent theme of the Bible, from Genesis to Revelation. It is God's great work in the creation and redemption of all things, through Jesus Christ,

"The foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men" (1 Corinthians 1:25). Unlike deniers whose life is a bad novel-- repetitive, self-contradictory, sententious [sanctimonious, contentious], foolish, and even at times ill-intentioned," we have hope—in Christ, through the Word. "... This is the testimony: that God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He who has the Son has life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have life. These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life, and that you may continue to believe in the name of the Son of God" (1 John 5:11-13).

"God's Word is our great heritage and shall be ours forever;
To spread its light from age to age shall be our chief endeavor.
Through life it guides our way, in death it is our stay.
Lord, grant, while worlds endure, we keep its teachings pure
Throughout all generations. Amen" (TLH 283).
