LUTHER AND THE OFFICE OF THE CHRISTIAN TEACHER

In July, 1530, Luther wrote a special treatise addressed especially to parents, urging them to keep their children in school. In that treatise, the Reformer exalted the teaching profession in the following words:

"I would briefly say that a diligent and pious schoolteacher or master or whoever the person is who faithfully trains and teaches children can never be sufficiently rewarded and repaid with any money, as even the heathen Aristotle says. [*This Greek philosopher said: "Those who educate*



children well are more to be honored than those who produce them. For the latter give them only life; the former give them the art of living well." Luther probably had this saying in mind.]

Yet this work is shamefully despised among us as if it were nothing whatever. Still we want to be Christians.

If I myself could or should be obliged to leave the office of the ministry and other duties, I would rather have the office of schoolmaster or teacher of children than any other office. For I know that next to the ministry this is the most useful, the greatest, and the best. In fact, I do not know which of the two is the better; for it is hard to tame old dogs and to make old rascals pious. Yet this is the task at which the preacher must labor and often labor in vain. But

one can bend and train young trees more easily even though some of them break in the process.

My friend, let it be considered one of the greatest virtues on earth faithfully to train the children of other people. Very few people - in fact, practically none - do this for their own children."



It is interesting how little things change over the centuries as still today parents often neglect what will bring their children great blessing. These words of Luther ought to be taken to heart by all who teach in Christian schools and Sunday schools, or have received a training which qualifies them to serve in such schools. But it is also a reminder to all members who support a school of the tireless and unnoticed labor of love that happens day after day in a Christian school. Please appreciate this gift of the Lord, particularly parents who are well-served by the Christian teachers who give of themselves for their children's spiritual well-being.

- * **General Fund** offerings in June totaled \$86,320 vs disbursements of \$74,984, resulting in an accrued negative balance of \$ -4,676 for FY18. **However**, \$84,613 was returned to the General Fund Reserve by the Boards of Education, Trustees, Regents, and Missions from their unused subsidy for the year, which resets their starting balances to \$0 for the new Fiscal Year 2019. The resulting Reserve account balance (less investment capital losses of \$2,486) is \$307,317.
- * **ILC Building Projects** offerings in June totaled \$5,395 vs the monthly mortgage payment of \$8,000, resulting in a year end balance of \$15,500. As previously reported, an extra payment of \$80,000 on principal was made this Spring, which has saved total interest of \$115,000 on the AC/North Hall loan & decreased the loan term by 2 years.
- * **CEF**: revenue in June totaled \$44,425 from congregations' CEF loan repayments, which was partially offset by investment capital losses of -\$15,664 in the Investment Pool for the last quarter. The Pool valuation reported on 6/30/18 was \$1,662,855.
- * **MDF**: offerings in June totaled \$11,437 vs disbursements of \$21,666, leaving a balance of \$55,340.
- * **SAF**: received \$11,777 in June from congregational offerings (\$1,682) and student loan repayments (\$10,094) vs disbursements of \$1,855, resulting in a FY18 year end balance of \$77,286.
- * IIF: The ILC Improvement Fund June offering was \$668 vs \$83,508 disbursements (\$78,000 for Ingram Drive paving, \$5100 for Athletic Field Storage Building), resulting in an IIF balance of \$108,123. The Ingram Drive paving & lighting was completed June 8 at an estimated cost of \$92,000. The field house heating upgrade and several professorage repairs/upgrades remain to be completed this summer.
