# Sermon: Ezekiel 2:1-3:3

And He said to me, "Son of man, stand on your feet, and I will speak to you." <sup>2</sup>Then the Spirit entered me when He spoke to me, and set me on my feet; and I heard Him who spoke to me. <sup>3</sup> And He said to me: "Son of man, I am sending you to the children of Israel, to a rebellious nation that has rebelled against Me; they and their fathers have transgressed against Me to this very day. <sup>4</sup> For they are impudent and stubborn children. I am sending you to them, and you shall say to them, 'Thus says the Lord God.' 5 As for them, whether they hear or whether they refuse—for they are a rebellious house—yet they will know that a prophet has been among them. <sup>6</sup> "And you, son of man, do not be afraid of them nor be afraid of their words, though briers and thorns are with you and you dwell among scorpions; do not be afraid of their words or dismayed by their looks, though they are a rebellious house. <sup>7</sup>You shall speak My words to them, whether they hear or whether they refuse, for they are rebellious. <sup>8</sup> But you, son of man, hear what I say to you. # Board of Missions' Devotion

"For as the rain comes down, and the snow from heaven, And do not return there, But water the earth, And make it bring forth and bud, That it may give seed to the sower And bread to the eater, So shall My word be that goes forth from

My mouth; It shall not return to Me void, But it shall accomplish what I please, And it shall prosper in the thing for which I sent it.

Isaiah 55:10-11

One of the challenges we face in life is the fact that sometimes things work and sometimes they don't. We rely on all sorts of things in our daily lives. We probably don't even think about most of those things, that is, until they stop working. For example, we don't think twice about how we're going to get somewhere until our car, for some reason, stops working.

We stop working, too. As we get older, our eyes stop working so that we need glasses. Our legs stop working as they used to, and we need a walker. Eventually, we run into all sorts of things that don't work, and this will continue because nothing lasts forever. Nothing works forever.

Well, almost nothing. There is one thing that always works, and that's God's Word as our passage makes clear. In this world where everything eventually stops working, we have something that we can hold on to that lasts forever. What a wonderful truth this is for us to cling to!

Our text compares God's Word to rain and snow coming down from heaven and watering the earth. Water is vitally important. We wouldn't live very long without it. Where there is water, there is green and life. Where there is no water, there is only dry and weary dust. If you want proof of that, look at a satellite view of Egypt. Where there is water because of the Nile River, it's green. But if you move away from the river, there is nothing but desert.

Do we see how well this comparison fits God's Word? If you want something good for giving eternal life and keeping people alive, the Word of God is what you're looking for. As surely as the rain falls from the sky and waters the ground, supplying "seed to the sower and bread for food" (2 Corinthians 9:10), so God's Word goes out and accomplishes what He purposes. When God spoke at creation, there was no doubt that light and land and water and everything else would come into existence. When Jesus spoke to heal the blind and the lame and raise the dead, the Word was always sure to accomplish its purpose. When God speaks, His Word does what He sends it to do.

God's Word works. Just as when He said, "Let there be light" and there was light, so also, when God says through the pastor at one's Baptism, "I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," that one is truly baptized. God has claimed that one to be His own dear child. The water connected with the Word works at creating faith and causes one to trust in Jesus for salvation.

It's God's Word alone that accomplishes what we never could. If not for God's Word, all of our efforts would be in vain. It's God's Word alone that succeeds in creating faith and bringing about salvation. Paul says in Romans 10:17, "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." We who were born dead in trespasses and sins could never bring ourselves to faith. Thank God that His Word accomplishes His purposes and succeeds in bringing us to faith so that we might have eternal life with Him. In all that we seek to accomplish, may God grant that we ever cling to His Word.
