UNDERSTANDING OUR FAITH - JUDGEMENT

Advent is a season of preparation as we await the coming of the Lord. While it leads us into the Christmas season and the celebration of our Savior's birth, it also turns our thoughts to the end of the world, and the coming of our Lord in judgment. Many of the sermon texts assigned for this season of the church year address the subject of judgment.

No one will escape the judgment. Concerning the Lord's return to judgment we read in Scripture: "... for we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ" (Romans 14:10); "And before Him shall be gathered all nations: and He shall separate them one from another, as a shepherd divides his sheep from the goats" (Matthew 25:32); "We must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ ..."(2 Corinthians 5:10) "The quick (living) and the dead" will be judged as we confess in the Apostolic Creed. According to Acts 10:42, the judge will be the Lord Jesus Christ for "He was ordained of God to be the Judge of the quick and the dead." Jesus did not come into the world to condemn it, but to save it.

Scripture tells us, "If Thou, Lord should mark iniquities, O Lord, who shall stand" (Psalm 130:3)? According to the standard of the Law no one can be justified, (Psalm 143:2). According to the Law all people are condemned for that is the nature and force of the Law. The Judge Himself tells us by what standard people shall be judged. "The word, which I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day" (John 12: 48). According to Romans 2:16 the word is the Gospel which is either received in faith or rejected in unbelief. "He that believes and is baptized shall be saved ..." (Mark 16:16). Death, which is of the Law, shall come upon all who have rejected life, which is in Christ. The debt of sins, which we have committed under the Law, was satisfied by the atonement of Christ. Joy and peace of Christmas for the faithful is not tied to the economy. It is anchored in the Child whose birth we celebrate at Christmas. Joy and peace is a fruit of faith in Him whose blood has washed away sin, and whose death has removed the curse that hung over us. The Apostle John records the inspired word of God which says, "He that has the Son has life ..." (1 John 5:11). The believer in Christ, the Son of God and the promised Messiah, is saved! Scripture describes such believers in the Lord Jesus as "sheep," who on the Day of Judgment shall be invited into heaven. This Gospel promise is so broad in its reach that it includes people of all races and nations. It looks not at what sin one has committed. While the Gospel is for all, it embraces those who repent of their sins, and who believe in Jesus Christ. "Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that hears My word, and believes on Him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life" (John 5:24).

On the other hand, they who will not repent of their sins can only give hypocritical lip service to Christ, if they speak of Him at all. They who use Christ as a cover for sin or who choose to pursue a life of sin and its deceitful pleasures will find that they will be on the outside looking in on judgment day, just as surely as those who believed that they could be saved by their own merit works. They will not be condemned, because Jesus did not die for them, or because He did not want to save them, or because they were sinners, or even greater sinners than others, but simply because they rejected the Gospel. They rejected Christ! They rejected the atonement. Their sins are still counted against them. "... He that does not believe shall be damned" (Mark 16:16).

It is quite clear to the comfort of penitent sinners, and to the chagrin of the impenitent. Judgment will be meted out on the basis of one's relationship to Christ, or lack thereof.

Pastor Update: For the past three years Pastor has been struggling with unrelenting lower back and leg issues. In 2016 he had surgery to help provide relief to the nerves going down his right leg. That helped at the time, but the back pain continued and a nerve to the right leg likely has permanent damage which is causing more problems. Three different reputable orthopedic surgeons recommend fusion. However, insurance has also been unwilling to authorize surgery on the basis of technicalities. This week Pastor's surgeon made a direct phone call which made it clear to the insurance company that there was a need for this. As a result, things moved quite quickly in scheduling a fusion surgery for this coming Wednesday. It is said that 4-6 weeks is common for recovery with low-impact work. Pastor hopes that he can contribute some during the Advent and Christmas season. But there are a few different quest speakers lined up for preaching through January 6. If there is any emergency pastoral care, you can still call Pastor and he will line up pastoral care. He would appreciate your prayers!
