

General Fund – Offerings in Nov. totaled \$88,200 vs disbursements of \$91,846. While offerings this month exceeded the monthly average needed (\$81,600), the large deficit is due partly to a YTD offering shortfall (\$66,000) and partly to a YTD budget disbursement overage (\$25,000). Hopefully this deficit will be reduced over the next months. The General Fund is one of our main funds which subsidizes the budgets of the Boards of Trustees, ILC Regents, Missions, and Ed & Publications. It is supported by congregational offerings to the CLC Cooperative Budget Plan (CBP)

ILC Operations -November ILC revenue was \$114,461 vs disbursements of \$119,754.

ILC Building Projects – November congregational offerings were \$2,884 vs disbursements of \$8,000 for the monthly loan repayment on the Academic Center & North Hall.

CEF - November revenue was \$40,353 from CEF loan repayments vs disbursements of \$3,382.

MDF – November offerings totaled \$9,456 vs disbursements of \$18,653 mostly for BELC Rice & Christmas gifts (\$12,500), but also for foreign mission church repairs (\$2,500), exploratory outreach (\$1,200 India tracts & Mexico travel), bibles (\$500), part-time missionaries' travel (\$317).

SAF – November revenue of \$6,862 included congregational offerings (\$1,661) and student loan re-payments (\$5,201) vs disbursements of \$12,123, for Student Grants, Loans, & Scholarships.

Kinship – November cong & sponsor offerings of \$9,344 vs disbursements of \$24,243 for foreign missions: Christmas gifts for 518 India & Africa children (\$2,990), India pastor medical aid (\$2000), annual leprosy aid (\$1,150), bimonthly pastor support (\$6,640), bimonthly orphan support (\$7,740), BELC semi-annual widow support (\$3,300).
