The Lord's Supper Preparation

As a reminder, communicants are to examine themselves prior to communing. 1 Corinthians 11:27: "But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup."

Prayer before the Lord's Supper:

Lord God, You invite all who are burdened with sin to come to You for rest. In the sacrament of Holy Baptism You called me to be Your child by the Holy Spirit. I now come at Your invitation to receive the holy body and blood of my Savior, Jesus Christ, in the sacrament of Holy Communion. Prepare my heart, Lord, to receive this precious meal with a repentant heart: sorry for my sins and recognizing they deserve punishment, but also rejoicing in the full forgiveness You have granted me by grace through Jesus' holy and precious blood shed for me at Strengthen my faith, the cross. increase my love and hope in You, and assure me of Your blessed peace. Hear me for the sake of Jesus, my dear Savior, Amen.

Prayer after the Lord's Supper:

Blessed Savior, Jesus Christ, You have given Yourself to me in this holy sacrament. Thanks and praise be to You for Your divine tenderness and love shown to me, Your child. I humbly ask you, now that I've received Your body and blood in the Sacrament, continue to fill me with the power of Your Holy Spirit. May I be led to ever embrace by faith the treasures of Your grace imparted to me, especially the forgiveness of sins and fellowship with You. The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ?

CHILDREN ARE A HERITAGE OF THE LORD

Proverbs records, "The fear of the Lord is to hate evil; pride and arrogance and the evil way and the perverse mouth I hate" (Proverbs 8:13). Notice that the Lord does not hate the sinner. He hates what is produced by the corrupt heart of the sinner. Proverbs says again, "These six *things* the Lord hates, Yes, seven *are* an abomination to Him: A proud look, a lying tongue, hands that shed innocent blood, a heart that devises wicked plans, feet that are swift in running to evil, a false witness *who* speaks lies, and one who sows discord among brethren" (Proverbs 6:16-19). The Lord calls the sinner to turn from every manifestation of evil.

The consequence of such actions as the Lord hates is the death of the sinner who lives in sin and dies in impenitence. Through the prophet Ezekiel the Lord said, "I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but that the wicked turn from his way and live. Turn from your evil ways! For why should you die, O house of Israel" (Ezekiel 33:11)? Why? Even Jesus weeps.

That our Lord earnestly desires the repentance of the wicked and desires the salvation of the sinner is proven by the promise and sending of the Savior Who said, "I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance" (Luke 5:32). Jesus then proceeded to confirm His love. He gave up His life as He bore the sins of the world upon His shoulders. He said on the cross, "Father forgive them for they do not know what they do" (Luke 23:34). At the cross, the rulers looking on sneered, and soldiers mocked. How deep the depth of unbelief and hatred that was directed at Jesus by those who rejected Him! And so it is today.

How dark is the heart of those who live in rejection of Christ and His cross! We see the darkness of unbelief – let *us* beware – in the hypocrisy, hatred, and evil all around us from the halls of congress to the streets of our cities. We have seen the face of the devil in the face of fallen man. We have heard the sounds of evil. We daily witness the coarseness of evil. "God, for Jesus' sake have mercy on us, and forgive us our sin. Help us to hate evil as You hate evil."

Life begins at conception. Among countless manifestations of evil that the Lord hates is the destruction of the unborn. The irony is that those who promote and perform abortion of the child at any stage within the womb would not be here if their parents had destroyed them in the womb.

Said Job, "Your hands have made me and fashioned me, an intricate unity; yet You would destroy me. Remember, I pray, that You have made me like clay. And will You turn me to dust again? Did You not pour me out like milk, and curdle me like cheese, clothe me with skin and flesh, and knit me together with bones and sinews? You have granted me life and favor, and Your care has preserved my spirit" (Job 10:8-10). God forms the child within the womb. Jesus was not a nothing; He was not a blob in the womb. Jesus was a child, a living

being, from His conception. The Lord knew Jeremiah before he was born. The Lord Who blessed Adam and Eve and told them to bring forth children knows and cares about the child in the womb.

It is not part of the ceremonial law, it is not part of the civil law; it is part of the moral law. "If men fight, and hurt a woman with child, so that she gives birth prematurely, yet no harm follows, he shall surely be punished accordingly as the woman's husband imposes on him; and he shall pay as the judges *determine*. But if *any* harm follows, then you shall give life for life..." (Exodus 21:22-23). Life is a gift of God; it is sacred.

Margaret Sanger (1879-1966), the patron saint of the women's movement today, and the founder of the abortion promoter and provider now known as *Planned Parenthood*, said:

In New York recently (January 2019) the abortion industry has shown the face of evil. We saw the celebration of evil. We heard the mouth of evil spilling forth verbal vomit in praise of what is called hypocritically and deceptively, the "Reproductive Health Act." Allowances for abortion in New York have been expanded so widely as to be meaningless to one bent on aborting a child "just because". The recently passed abortion bill in New York broadened a "woman's right" to destroy a child, if she chooses, up to the moment of birth. The passage of this bill was met with applause, laughter, and back-slapping by politicians who passed it and by the gallery of abortionists who were present. The governor called it a "victory for all New Yorkers." The evil is a slap at the Lord God, the Creator of life. It is a slap at those who fear the Lord and respect His Word. However, it is not without consequence. "The Lord knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the ungodly shall perish" (Psalm 1:6)

It is against the law to destroy a turtle egg on a beach. It is not against the law to abort a child. An individual can be tried for killing an unborn child in an auto accident or for murdering an expectant mother and the fruit of her womb. It is not against the law to abort a child. Next to each of the names of expectant mothers memorialized at the World Trade Center after 9/11 appears the

phrase "and her unborn child." The only difference between the murder of those children and children wantonly killed by abortion is the name of the terrorists. The unborn killed on 9/11 are memorialized. The death of those under the misnamed "Reproductive Health Act" is celebrated as the governor ordered the World Trade Center and other landmarks to be bathed in pink light.

Without question the issue of abortion has been politicized. However, it is not a political issue. It is a moral issue. On judgment day, the Lord will not inquire about one's politics. He Who knows the heart will look for recognition of sin, confession of sin, and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. And He will without fail know each by their fruits. No one will sneak into heaven who in impenitence and unbelief robbed the unborn child of its time of grace.

Scripture declares, "Behold, children are a heritage from the Lord, the fruit of the womb is a reward" (Psalm 127:3). And again, "Children's children [grandchildren] are the crown of old men, and the glory of children is their father" (Proverbs 17:6). Only of a woman who has borne children can it be said, "Her children rise up and call her blessed: her husband also, and he praises her ... A woman who fears the Lord, she shall be praised" (Proverbs 31:28,30).

Children are "persons" of the Father's love from conception. Without His blessing they would not be conceived. They are not by some arbitrary desire of parents, or politicians, to be denied their time of grace. They are not to be denied the opportunity to be brought to Jesus in baptism through which He counts them as His children and makes them heirs of eternal life. Of this, of course, unbelief knows nothing and cares even less.

We pray to God it is not so, but if there are some who read this who have in weakness or from lack of understanding had an abortion and are now troubled in conscience, you should know that for the sake of the Savior, Jesus Christ, God is merciful to those who confess their sin. He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness (1 John 1). Whatever our conscience accusation, we all may go to the precious and abiding Word of our God to be assured of His love, as well as strength to overcome evil when confronted with it. Our Lord invites us to come to Him with our burdens and He will give us rest (Matthew 11:28). Speak to your pastor or fellow believers who will lead you to the precious promises of the Lord.

Pray that hardened hearts will respond positively to God's call to repentance so that the suicidal course of this nation will be stopped, and more importantly that every child who is conceived may be born and brought to know the grace of God. Pray that the people of this nation will seek out leaders who respect the Lord and His will so that the Gospel may without hindrance be preached to the salvation of souls for whom the Lord Jesus died.
